




Kirby Santos is a New York City mixed media artist who's nom de plume "Hola Chi Chi' can be found hidden ubiquitously throughout the city streets.



Always exploring new techniques and mediums, his work is constantly seeking to break new ground. Katz works with a number of different materials including repurposed tech and a wide variety of found objects. Most recently, Katz has been working with antique findings enveloped in pigmented encaustics, which, when combined, create complex, painterly three dimensional assemblages. His work is a direct reflection of his multifaceted life and is heavily influenced by both the ever-evolving digital world and humanity's increasingly symbiotic relationship with technology. Katz sees his work as social commentary and uses it as an outlet for his often controversial opinions on modern life.


Ben Katz was mentored by the New York pop artist James Rizzi prior to his death in December of 2011. Katz credits Rizzi with encouraging him to channel his many interests and talents into a bourgeoning artistic practice. Katz soon had his first solo show, "Robots of Unusual Size" in June 2012 at the Fe Gallery in Pittsburgh, PA. The exhibition received critical acclaim and Katz's work was subsequently featured on the front page of the Pittsburgh Tribune. In March of 2016, after some time solely showing and selling to private collectors, Katz met Georges Berges.

Having found a kindred spirit in the art dealer, Katz ended his extended hiatus from gallery shows and had a remarkably successful solo show at the Georges Berges Gallery in Soho in June of 2016.

Since, Katz has continued to create, his art manifesting in both the physical and digital - an inevitable fruit of his own views on the synergistic relationship humans have with technology. In 2018, his work was featured in Artnet News for setting an unprecedented record price in cryptocurrency for a work of art. From his 2019 show at the Bitcoin Center in Miami to a feature in the Harper's Bazaar Art issue discussing bitcoin and the art of business, Katz has increasingly become a presence in the world of technology and art. Katz is now working on a new body or work and with a number of different galleries for exhibitions in New York and Internationally. John-Herbert Wright


From the tender age of eight, Wright gravitated to painting as an escape expressing a rich inner world. His work heavily relies upon dark figurations amongst an urban landscape leaving the viewer space to navigate the world he creates. An analogy of the human condition; centering the female nude/mother and child as the protagonist, he tells the story of the broken seeking respite, the downcast, the other. Wright seeks to illuminate the universe of darkness within all of us, within himself, and that darkness contrasted with fragility has always been at the epicenter of his work.

Wright has managed to create a niche for himself as a painter and street-wear designer, contributing to the role the graphic t-shirt played in disseminating New York street culture across the globe. Transferring the techniques of garment making onto his canvases, Wright's paintings feature backdrops of multiple layers of silk-screened images, drawings and text. Although his success has been celebrated, in many ways till now, Wright has also kept his own story on fade.

Rewind & Reflect debuts John-Herbert Wright, the next chapter in the artists' journey. For his solo premiere, Wright explores the theme of abstract figurations in nine new paintings reflecting an intimate expression of his own personal story narrated through the music that has provided the soundtrack to his life.

In the new collection, the artist reflects on the evolution of fatherhood across multigenerations, silkscreening personal photographs from his childhood and family history to weave his story, highlighting relationships between himself, his father and grandfather. His own challenges with violence and mental health, understanding and embracing his own unique multi-racial, multi-ethnic identity, with roots spanning from the Philippines to Harlem ca. 1950s.

Each painting is titled after a song that has impacted the artist. From his father's favorite musicians like James Taylor and Simon & Garfunkel to his own contemporary heroes like Nipsey Hussle and Juice Wrld, the music serves as a creative bridge if you will between his abstract streams of consciousness and the world at large. The collection celebrates everything that has brought the artist from standing behind the hat as Mr. John Wright to standing tall as John-Herbert Wright, the painter willing to not only craft but curate and celebrate his past and all of its beauty and bruises through this show.

From the inside it feels sacred but from the outside, it's far from that — leading to a feeling of isolation that can only be saved by addiction.


