




AN ALL-IN CALL FOR 2026

God Doesn't Need Perfection, He Needs Willingness

ABRAHAM: The Blind Yes



MOSES: The Reluctant Yes



The Call: 'Go to the land I will show you.' (Genesis 12)

The Obstacle: He didn't know the destination.

The Result: His obedience birthed a nation.

The Call: Called from a burning bush. (Exodus 3)

The Obstacle: Felt unqualified and reluctant.

The Result: Delivered Israel from Egypt.

God doesn't call the confident—He empowers the obedient.

Your Past Does Not Disqualify Your Future

GIDEON

(The *Fearful* Yes)

Context: Called a “mighty warrior” while hiding in fear (Judges 6).

Outcome: God used a hesitant man to defeat the Midianites.

PAUL

(The *Repentant* Yes)

Context: Persecutor turned Apostle (Acts 9).

Outcome: His “Yes” followed surrender; the Gospel spread to the Gentiles.

PETER

(The *Redeemed* Yes)

Context: Jesus said “Follow Me” (Matt 4), yet Peter later denied Him.

Outcome: Failure didn’t cancel the calling. His preaching birthed the Church.

The Pattern of Obedience

Every one of these people had flaws. None were perfect.

God wasn't looking for perfection—He was looking for a decisive YES.

Let your yes be yes, and your no be no.

— Matthew 5:37

The Context

Spoken during the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus was confronting the divided heart. He addressed people using religious language to mask compromised lives.

The Mandate

If you belong to Him, your life should be so aligned that a simple “yes” is enough. No “I promise,” no “Honest to God.” Just a wholehearted YES.

What an All-In 'Yes' Looks Like

Half-hearted faith never produces wholehearted transformation.

~~No more one foot in, one foot out.~~

~~No more Sunday faith, Monday compromise.~~


~~No more believing truth, but resisting obedience.~~

~~No more calling Jesus "Lord," but ignoring His voice.~~

~~No more knowing the Word, but not living it.~~

The Framework: The 3 Ws

A real yes to God is not emotional—it's intentional.
It aligns your life in three specific areas.



Your Declaration for 2026

YES to His Will.

YES to His Ways.

YES to His Word.

*No more divided hearts. No more half measures.
Because eternity is closer than we think.*

God's Will

Conviction over Comfort

The Model: Jesus in Gethsemane (Matthew 26:39). "Not My will, but Yours be done." Jesus knew suffering was coming. Comfort was available, but eternity was on the line.

The Trade-Off: God's Will is not about your comfort; it is about eternal purpose. It often costs us temporary comfort to accomplish something eternal.

Saying 'Yes' to God's Will means choosing conviction over comfort.

God's Ways

Character over Compromise

The Model: Daniel in Babylon (Daniel 1:8).
“Daniel resolved not to defile himself.” He lived in a godless culture where compromise was easier. Obedience came with consequences, yet he chose God's Ways daily.

The Trade-Off: Daniel didn't just believe right; he lived right. Character is what you choose when compromise is cheaper.

Saying 'Yes' to God's Ways means choosing character over compromise.

God's Word


Truth over Trend

The Model: Jesus in the Wilderness (Matthew 4). Every temptation was answered with: 'It is written...' He didn't fight feelings or opinions. He stood on the Word.

The Trade-Off: 'Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will never pass away' (Matt 24:35). Trends change; Truth remains.

Saying 'Yes' to God's Word means choosing truth over trend.
