FAMILY SELF SUFFICIANCY

As of September 30, 2022, Stillwater Housing Authority had 45 families participating in the FSS Program. During the past year enrollments were put "on hold" through the Department of Housing and Urban Development due to new guidelines being prepared. Each Housing Authority developed a new action plan outlining guidelines for the local FSS Program. A new contract of Participation was developed, and existing participants are encouraged to sign the new contract.

During the time frame of October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022 there were five participants who graduated from the program. The amount of escrow received varied from \$8,233.26 to \$23,989.48. One of the participants is currently in the process of buying a home.
