CENTRE FINANCES

As those of you who attended the AGM in October will be aware, the revenue we have received in the past few years has not met the cost of running the Centre and we have made increasing losses. Furthermore, in 2020, our revenue was drastically reduced due to the cancellation of many rallies as a result of the Covid pandemic, so we can expect a further loss for 2020, and in all probability, in 2021 too.

In some respects, we have been the victims of our own success. Some of our best traditions, which no-one would like to see disappear incur costs which we have to meet if we want our Centre to thrive. We love having a Centre Queen, and need to be able to contribute to the costs of the Queen and her retinue. We have a brilliant turn out for Easter and for May Day and the Children's sports; we want to be able to continue to have the marguees, and present decent quality medals for the sports.

The Centre does have some savings on account, but these savings would not cover the losses for more than 2 years. For this reason, it is imperative that we make cost savings to ensure we can continue as a Centre, and raise funds to get the Centre into a healthier financial position.

Fund raising - Centre Charity 2021

We are proud of the enormous amount of money we have donated to local charities over many years, however, we need to ensure we can continue this in years to come. For this reason, at the AGM, approval was given for the Centre to raise money to rebuild our own funds so that moving forwards, we are in a healthier position to continue as a Centre and go on to support more charities. On other words, for **2021 - Charity begins at home.** Please continue to save your old car and leisure batteries.

Fund raising – rally fees

- At present, each unit contributes £1.50 per rally to the Centre to cover the costs of administration, and all other costs incurred. From 2021 this cost will increase to £3 per unit per rally.
- The event shelters are costly to buy, and don't last very long, so we are asking for a small hire fee of £20 per shelter, per rally to maintain these.

At present, even these amounts do not cover all the costs, but we hope, with cost savings, we will be able to balance the books.

Cost savings – printing of brochures

In 2019 the cost of printing and postage for the brochure was over £4,300. For this reason, for 2021 we will not be producing a printed brochure, but will provide an electronic copy (pdf) of the brochure. See next page for details.

We ask for your support at this difficult time, and for your trust in us, that we will do our utmost for the wellbeing of the South Yorkshire Centre.

2021 RALLY PROGRAMME AND BROCHURE

Rally Programme

All rallies and social events advertised in the new brochure are subject to the Covid tier rules at the time of the rally. It goes without saying that we cannot predict what these will be. We cannot run a rally in an area which is in Tier 3, nor can you attend a rally if you live in a tier 3 area.

Any cancellations or updates will be put on the 'virtual flag' on the website, and also on Facebook.

- We will try and run rallies as site only if rules exclude having any social gathering.
- Where a marquee or hall has been booked and cannot be used, the rally fee will be reduced to take off the cost of these.

Rally Brochure

The cost of printing and postage for the 2019 brochure formed the majority of the loss made in that year. Hence, for 2021 we will not be producing a printed brochure, but will provide an electronic copy (pdf). Everyone who is a registered SYC member, and who completed and returned the request slip in the 2020 brochure will receive a complete pdf of the 2021 brochure via the email address which they have registered with the Caravan and Motorhome Club (CAMC). A pdf version of the brochure, without the names and addresses of the rally marshals will be available to view on the website as before.

If you have not requested a brochure, but would like one, a complete electronic pdf copy, including the rally marshal's contact details will be available on request to all CAMC members who are registered with SYC. Please email Claire Burgess, Honorary Secretary (details on website). Rally booking slips will be available to download from the website as usual.
