Deepening Roots and Expanding Reach

Our partnership with the **adopted Government-Aided School in Kozhikode** has been a story of transformation. What started as infrastructural support has now blossomed into a full-fledged ecosystem of change. The energy and curiosity we see there remind us why our "depth over scale" philosophy continues to matter.

In Kerala, our offerings have **grown beyond academics**. Music, dance, and even AI and Robotics are now part of the student experience — helping young minds discover confidence and creativity in ways we couldn't have imagined a few years ago.

We also welcomed our **newest learning center in Bevinmara, Bangalore**, expanding our reach to yet another community that believes education can change its future.

Alumni: The Circle of Giving Back

One of the most heartwarming milestones this year has been the rise of our alumni movement. Many of our **senior students are now returning as Associate Learning Facilitators and Coordinators**, earning while they learn, and giving back to the same centers where they once studied. This beautiful cycle of reinvestment — students becoming mentors, and mentees turning leaders — is at the heart of the community transformation we envisioned.

Building Corporate Pathways

We also took big steps in ensuring our students are career- and job-ready. From **Mu Pathshala by Mu Sigma**, which introduced our learners to the world of corporate internships, to our partnership with **Young Founders School** and exposure visits to **PwC and Hitachi**, we are steadily building a bridge between education and employability. Our first "core batch," now in Year 2, is walking this bridge with confidence.

One Family, Many Journeys

This year, we brought our entire team — from Kerala, Coimbatore, and Bangalore — together for a three-day **Annual Staff Retreat**. Those days were filled with laughter, learning, and deep connection. It was a reminder that our people are our biggest strength. Their commitment and joy are what truly make SOF a “workplace of choice.”

Staying True to Our Values

Our commitment to transparency and governance remained steadfast. We successfully completed two audits this year — one from auditors of our CSR partner and another for our **80G/12AA renewal, securing approval for the next ten years**. This milestone is a proud validation of the trust placed in us and the systems we continue to strengthen.

Looking Ahead – SOF 2.0 in Motion

With SOF 2.0 now in full swing, we are aligning ourselves **toward our 2032 Vision** — where each of our **10 centers will be thriving with over 120 students**, becoming vibrant learning ecosystems led by our own alumni and local facilitators.

Every passing year reaffirms that our greatest success lies not in numbers, but in the smiles, resilience, and self-belief we help unlock.

As we celebrate these achievements, we remain humbled by the challenges ahead and inspired by the resilience of our children. Today, we support **over 570 families across three states**, and our vision for the future only grows bolder.

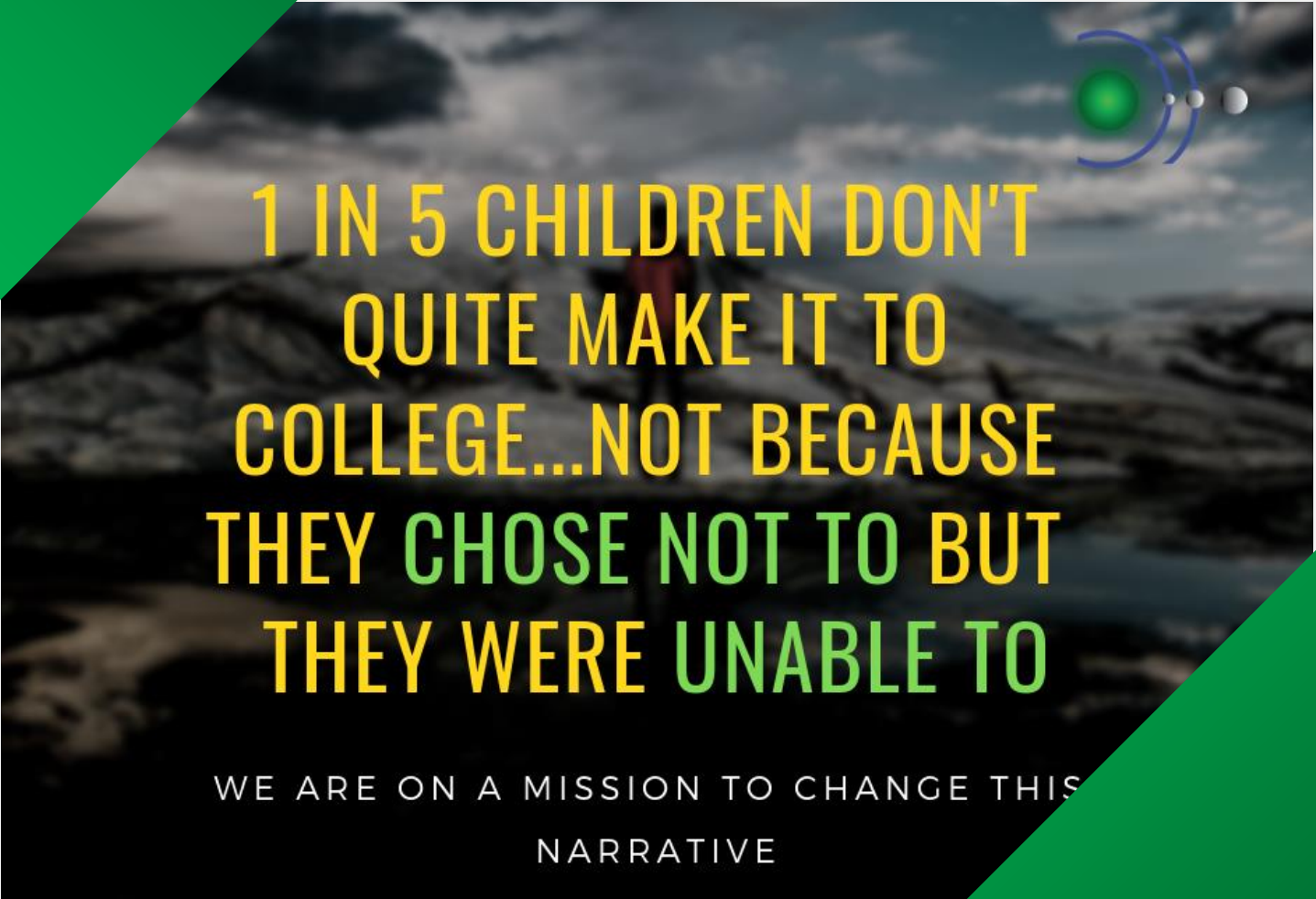

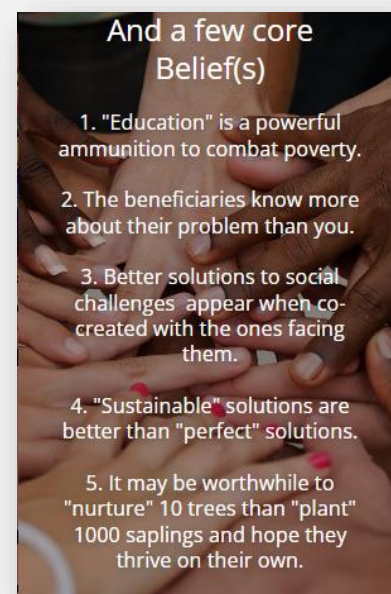
What are we trying to do?

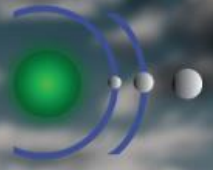
We are a simple nonprofit organization focused on increasing the number of **educated youths** emerging from **underserved communities**. To do so we run chains of **"After School Learning Centers"** setup within the communities providing access and exposure to everything that an affluent counterpart may get and **an unwavering commitment to be with the students in their educational journey till the end!**

Why are we doing this?

We strongly believe education is a life altering tool that can help "defeat" the vicious cycle of inter-generational poverty. However, we also learnt that continuing this educational journey is an overwhelming ordeal for economically challenged families! The "cracks" and the "constraints" surrounding their lives are just too many for them to continue keeping their children's "education" as their priority! That's the issue that bothers us deeply!

We also learnt that to address the scale of inequity - the defaults of the communities need to change. And to do that we need to flood the communities with more and more educated youths. **We are just triggering a BIGGER MOVEMENT of changes through each student we touch!**

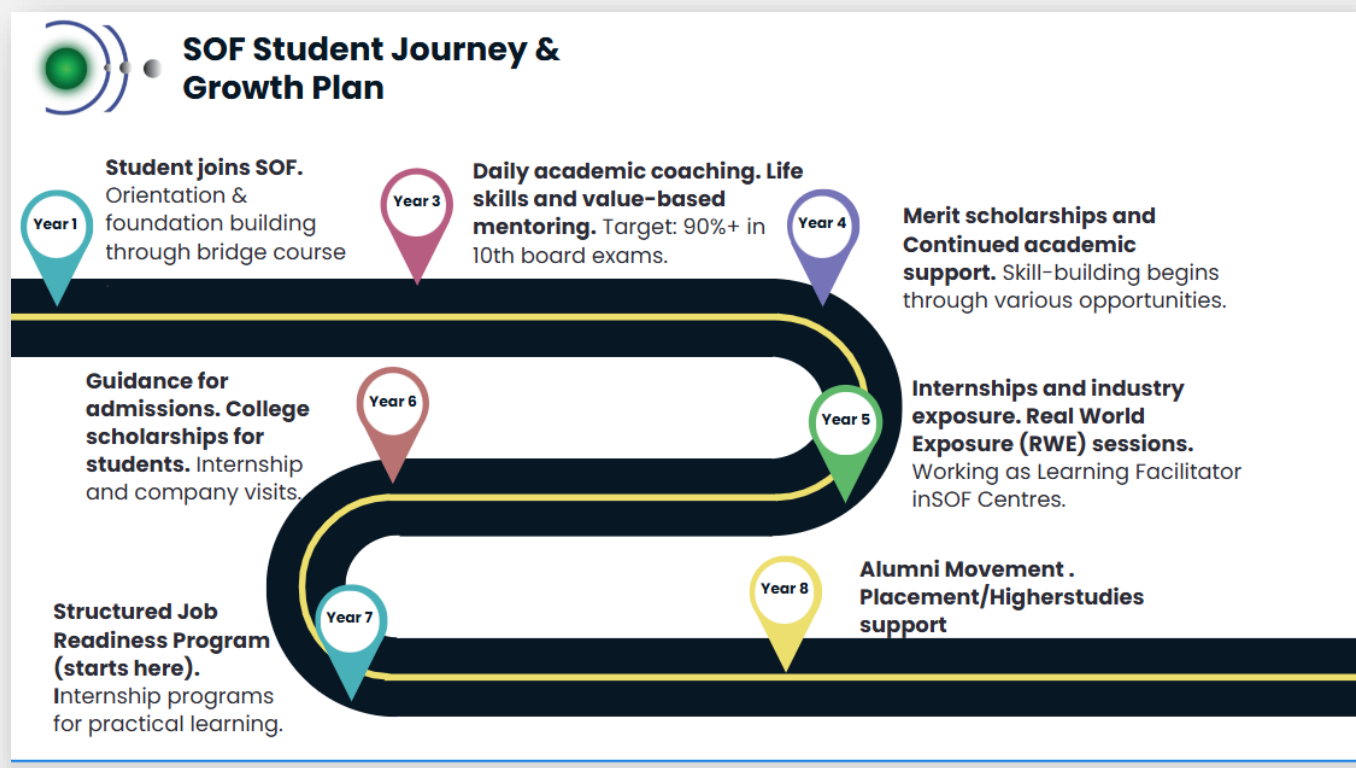

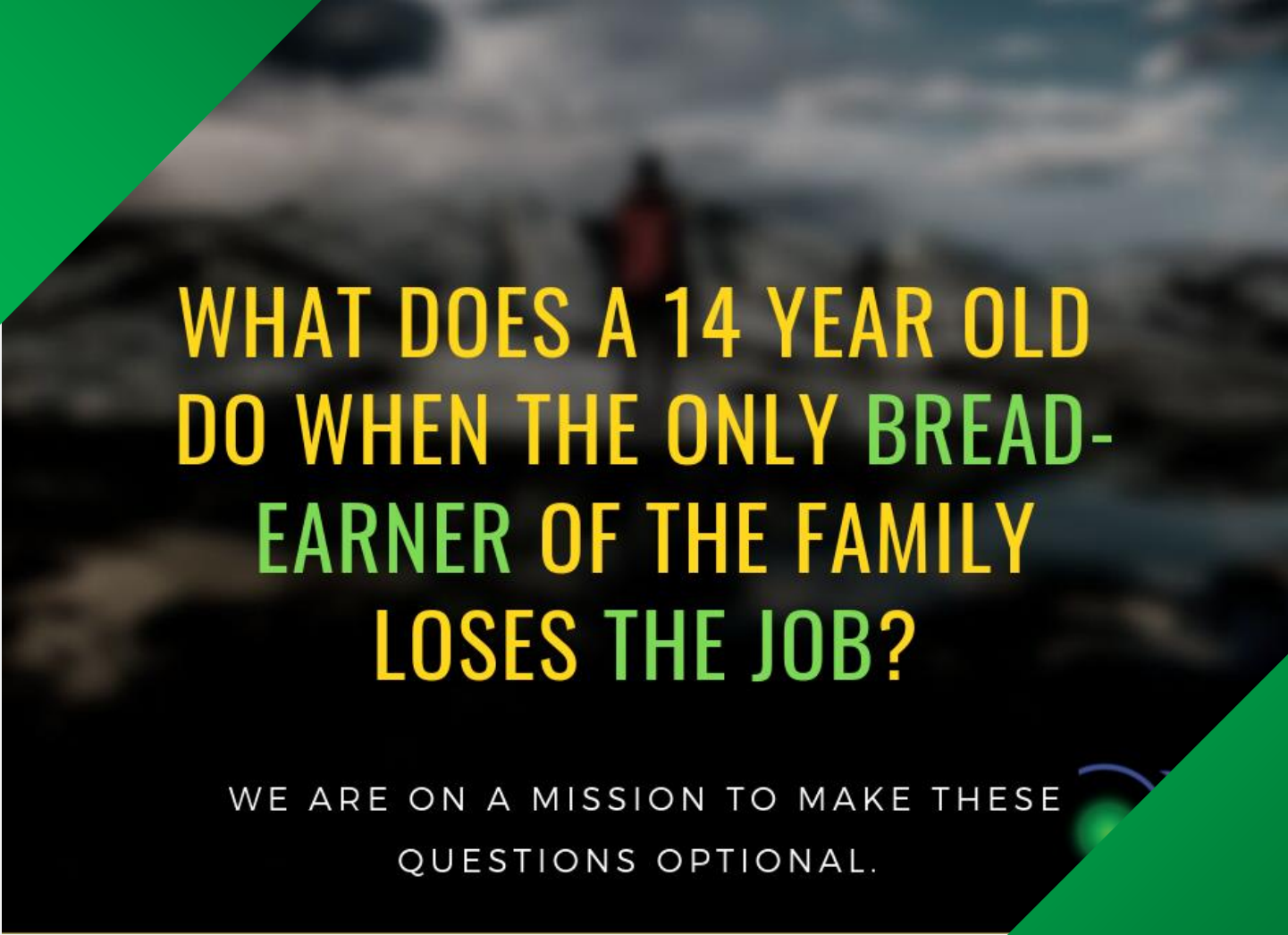
Our Vision, Mission and Beliefs

Our Approach

We start on the premise that we are ill equipped to understand any problem that we ourselves don't face, no matter how empathetic we may think we are. We also strongly believe in **a long-term deep involvement** where we be with the family for anywhere between 5 to 10 years. Once inducted we start a series of **Human Centered Design Iterations** with the family to solve EVERY hurdle that might impair the ability of their child to complete their education. We do this by either connecting them to existing solutions or funding them.

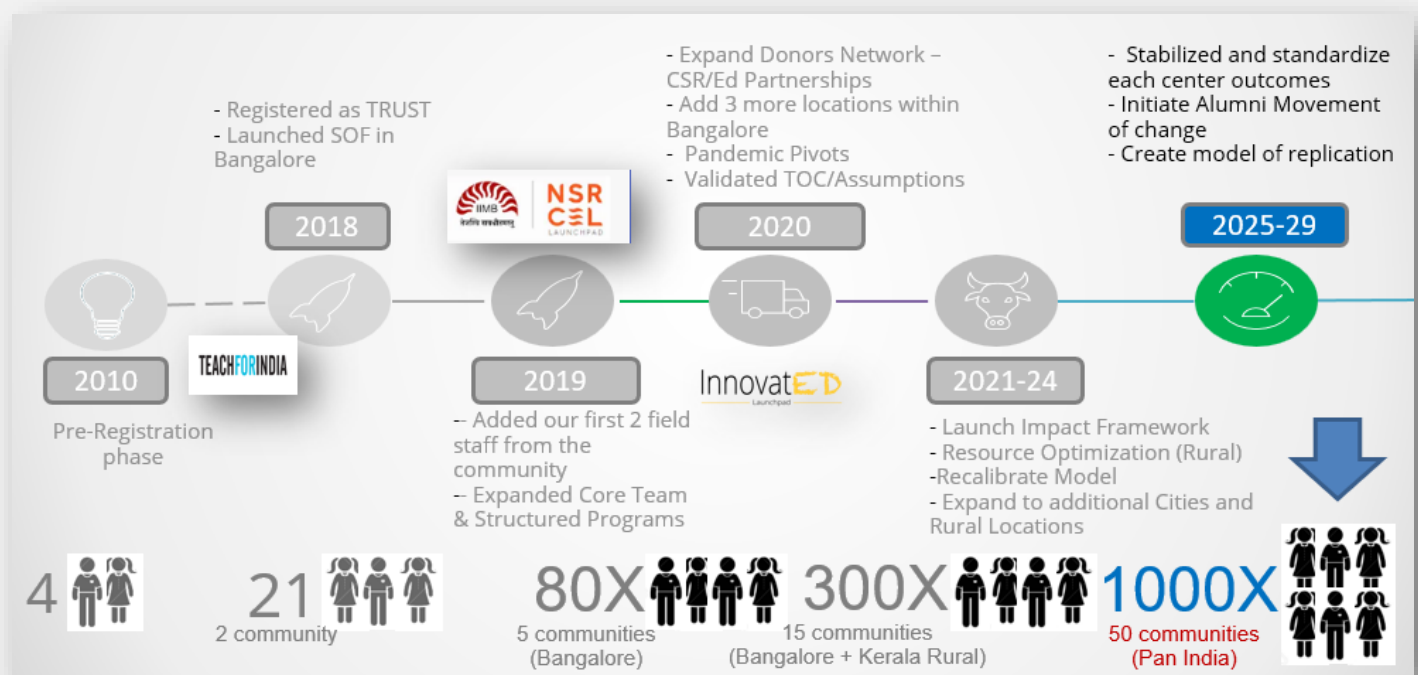

Our Impact so far and road ahead



We strongly believe **that the only metrics** that matters to us is the "destination" that we dream for each of our cohorts and the community. Everything else is just fluffy numbers!

In fact, we call each of our cohorts NOT by the year of them joining us, but the year they will graduate and get their job! **Our and their job is not done till then!**

“Between Year 1 and 7 - We were able to increase our tribe from 21 families (2019) to 560+ families across 10 locations in Bangalore, Coimbatore and Rural Kerala – hopefully triggering a new future for 20-25 communities in years to come”

Now in Year 8 and ahead – We are in our “SOF Phase 2.0”. We are ambitiously looking at expanding to 1000+ families / 50+ communities across PAN India with our recalibrated replication model BUT keeping our “essence” of “DEPTH” - sacred and intact!

Hopefully, each of our centers which get staffed with our own alumni/teachers from the community will soon start playing the role of "force-multipliers" and uplift the 250-200 households in each of the communities we touch!

Our interventions at this point includes providing **a safe learning space** with access to all kind of resources, daily/weekly Academic and Non Academic classes, offering full/partial finances of their college expenses through our scholarship programs, regular progress check with schools and parents and lastly internship/mentoring/counselling sessions with both parents and children on a regular basis.

We are also constantly in talks with partner organizations on adding more services like "financial umbrella" (Insurance, Saving Plans and access to low interest loans) , Career Awareness, Re-skilling, Health Insurance/Checkups and more that will help families stay on the path towards educating their child!

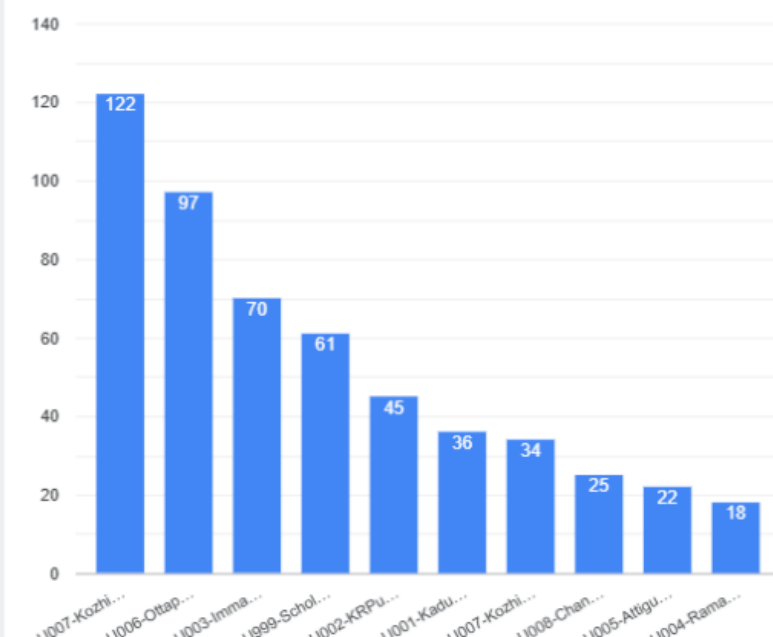

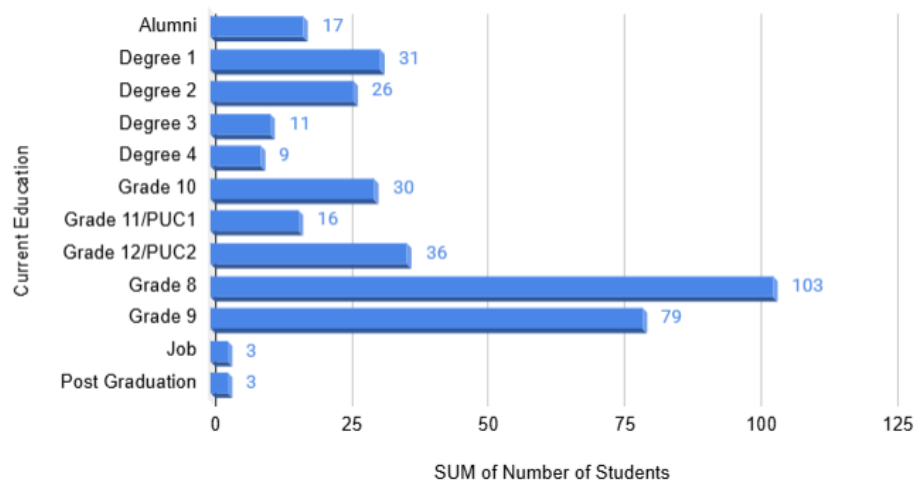
How are the students spread across SOF Locations?



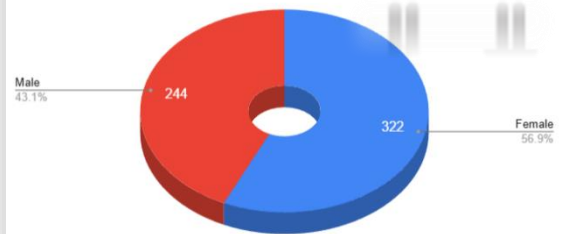

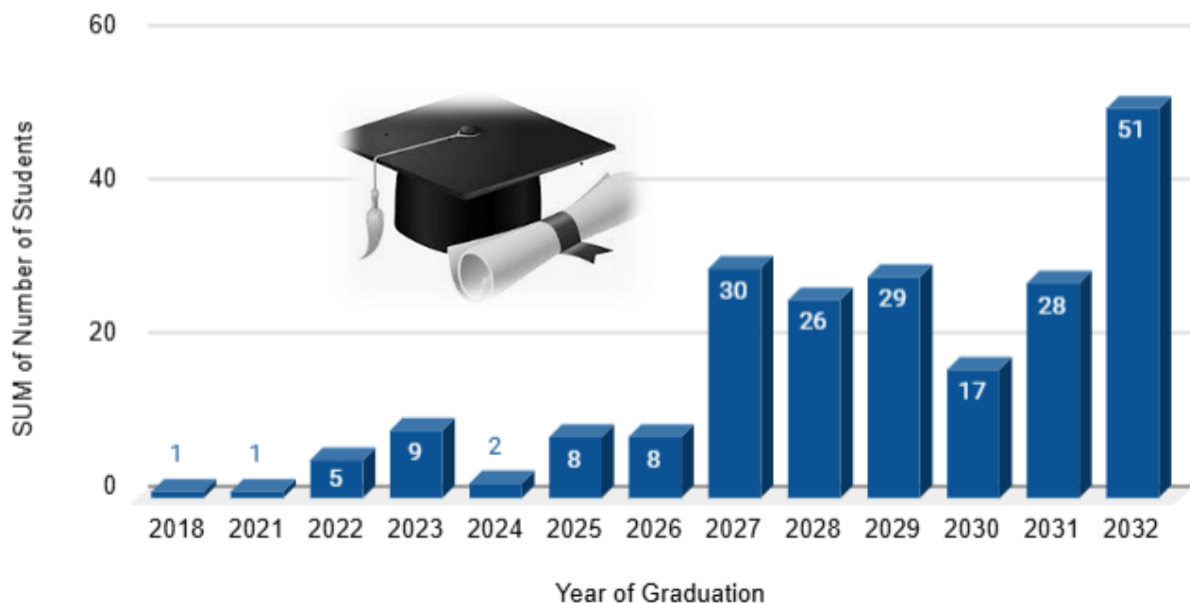
of Orbit Shifters vs Current Grade (Only G8 and upward)

Notes forming part of the Financial Statements for the year ended, 31st March, 2025

Note - 1 Background of the entity

SHIFTING ORBITS FOUNDATION("The Trust"), is a Trust created under the Deed of Trust dated 19th November, 2018 having its registered office at Villa 144 Phase 2, Adarsh Palm Meadows, Varthur Road, Ramagondanahalli, Whitefield S.O, Bangalore. The Trust has been set up to support and empower economically challenged families in having their children complete their education by means of Financial assistance and helping or collaborating with Existing NGO's, Government Programs or Educational Institutions for the same.

The Original Trust Deed was executed on 19 November 2018, with Sub Registrar, Shivajinagar and the Trust Deed was later amended on 5th September 2019.

Note - 2 Significant Accounting Policies

a) Basis of preparation of financial statements:

The Trust maintains its accounts on accrual basis following the historical cost convention in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP), in compliance with the accounting standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

b) Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Principles) requires the management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable.

c) Property Plant & Equipment:

Property Plant & Equipment's are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and amortization. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use.

Depreciation is provided using the Written Down Value Method ("WDV") over the useful lives of the assets considered by the management. Additions during the year are depreciated on a pro-rata basis.

d) Recognition of revenue

i. Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Trust and the revenue can be reliably measured.

ii. Interest Income is recognised on a time proportionate method, based on the transactional interest rates.

iii. Other items of income such as Gains from Mutual Funds are accounted as and when the right to receive arises.

e) Investments

Classification:

Investments in mutual Funds are treated as current investments.

Valuation:

Current investments are carried in the financial statement at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis.

Disposal of Investments:

On disposal of an investment, the difference between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds, net of expenses, is recognized in the profit and loss statement.

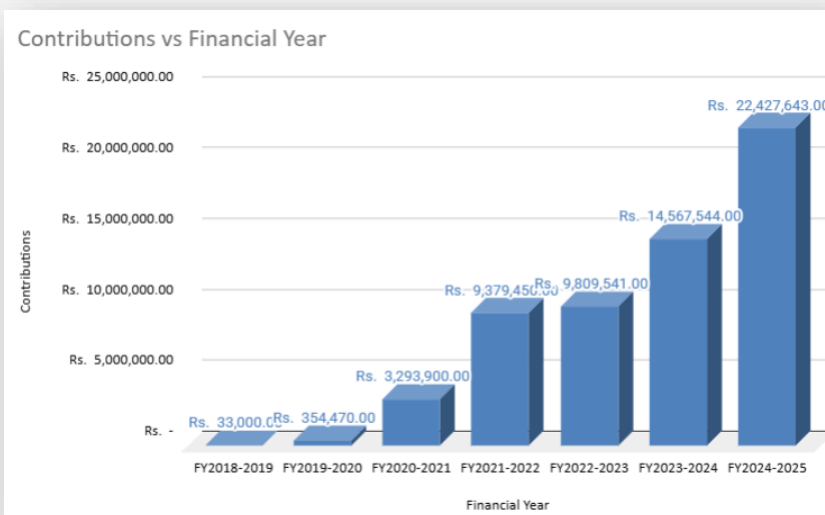
