It's hard to believe that we've just wrapped up our eighth camp of the season and that we only have one more camp to go before we tie things up for this year. It's definitely been a summer of variety with each week of camp being tailored to the specific needs, ages and backgrounds of the children. Each visiting team also brings its own flavor to the camp and this summer we've been blessed to have teams and individuals come from

the USA, Scotland and of course Romania to lead and assist with the camp programs each week.

As always it's been an amazing blessing to be able to bring more than 200 children from children's homes and under-privileged families through our sponsorship program. Many of these children come to camp for free and others pay a much reduced price depending on their circumstances. Thank you to all who have contributed and continue to make this possible.











Six of the camps this summer have been our usual camps for children and teens. The highlights have been the giant slip 'n slide and water balloon wars on the hot days, the zip line, shaving foam pies as forfeits, camp fires, and the competitions to win team points. The focus however are the worship times, bible teachings, and small group discussion times. We pray that the word that has gone out will bear much fruit.

We have also been able to have three camps for special needs children and young adults.

- Special needs young adults who live semi-independently and are supported by a Christian organization.
- Severely special needs children from a Christian children's home.
- Mildly special needs children who are in foster care who came with their foster families to camp. It has been a real joy and privilege to be able to welcome these children to Friendship Camp.

Prayer Points: Pray for children who have already been at camp this summer. For many it was their first time in a Christian camp and for some it was the first time they were given the chance hear the gospel. Pray that the seeds which were planted will grow and bear much fruit. Pray for our last camp which will run from August 25 to 29. Pray for the team and leaders who are preparing teachings, worship, competitions, games and lots more. Pray that the children who will come will hear and respond to the gospel.

LIGHT IN THE WINDOW America Tour '25



This was one of the most unique tours Friendship International has organized. It was not a group or a trio, duet or a soloist. It was the Heins, a young family, of 6, from our new ministry country. The Hein family is a close-knit Mennonite family from Belize where Alvin and family not only sing country style, but Alvin is also a rancher and farmer. So, the tour was intentionally planned to visit smaller country churches, set in rural America, where ranchers and farmers

were our main audience. We had concerts in Colorado, Montana, North Dakota and Nebraska.

The theme of the tour was *Light in the Window*, the title of a song which the family sung every night. What does placing a light or candle in the window mean?

The tradition of placing a simple candle in the window dates back to colonial days. It offered a signal to passing travelers that they would find shelter and warmth inside. It has been interpreted as a sign of welcome, beacon of hope or a symbol of spiritual significance. The lyrics bring out a meaningful message of hope in a troubled and dark world.

1. Come sad ones weary of your load, Stumbling and falling on the road. Lift up your eyes to heaven and view a candle in the window for you.

The main goal for the tour was to make our friends, new and old, aware of our plans to build and start the new Cayo School of Music and Art and to raise funds for this project. The reason for the Hein family's participation is because of their personal interest in seeing this school built for families in the community of Spanish Lookout where they live. There are schools in this community, but none of them offer music or art since they have no teachers qualified to teach in these areas. Plus, Alvin will be one of the teacher for guitar, writing and poetry.
