

What did we, here in America, do? We prayed and thank the Lord? Yes, the building needed a new roof,

but not one camper or staff member was injured. AND, even though we had used up all the funds available for camps, GOD came through for us, by having friends send donations, without knowing of the immediate need, enough to send from the states to Romania to cover the cost of a new roof and water damage that occurred from the roof being ripped off the building. all praise and thanksgiving for what is happening in my body. I'm not out of the woods yet, I have follow up visits and tests to determine the results of treatment. So, your prayers would be much appreciated. I feel great and look forward, faith believing, that God has much more in store for me.



Good news from Romania and Adi Muscan's health condition. This is what he writes, "About my the healing of my hand, we are moving forward. We are rejoicing in seeing everyday I am able to adjust to the "new" me and learning how to function without two fingers on my right hand. My hand is healing, it's still swollen. My doctors told me that it will take about 6 months until the healing is complete. In about a month I will start the therapy for the finger joints. They are still stiff, and quite painful when I try to move them. But, Praise the Lord! I have to believe that through this accident and the pain I endured as my fingers were cut off, the pain kept

me alert enough that my whole body did not fall on to the saw blade and end my life. Oh, God is so good! And for Tabita, thank the Lord for continued healing, it's a slow process but she is encouraged by less pain and continued strength in her legs. But now, when the weather is so humid and cold, it's sometimes difficult. But she is a fighter, always striving to get better. And thank God for our son, Ruben, what a blessing he has been, when not at school, he is here to attend to all of us, including Tabita's parents. Actually, he seems to be the only normal (healthy) person in the family right now. We can't wait for the day when we will be back to "normal", and be able to serve the Lord and encourage our camper family of children and work with orphans and foster children.

This verse continues to lead us forward as the winding road takes us along an exciting adventure towards our goal.

I am so thankful for the completion of my radiation treatments. Two week after completion we were on our way to Belize not knowing what to expect about a location to temporarily start the school, and the interest of our instructors, Are parents still interested in sending thier children for lessons, and are adults still interested in classes? Well, the answer was a unanimous, YES!



I first connected with the owner of our house/ school, Jacob Janzen, only to discover after 3 months being away, the house was still vacant, but the owner had in the meantime considered moving his family into the house. But this is how God works. . . . Af-

ter speaking with him, he admitted that it was still very uncertain as to when they would be moving because his present farm had not sold. After returning back to Colorado, I received a message of



good news from Jacob saying that they had decided to allow us to rent the house for at least 6 months, after which time it would be de-

cided if we can continue to use it for another 6 months. It seems this house is perfect for our beginnings. It has 5 bed rooms, large living room, dining room and two bathrooms. Jacob has suggested in the beginning he is willing to rent the house by the room so we are not paying rent for the entire house. If the Lord blesses and we need more space, we can add rooms. Please pray with us that the Lord will continue to confirm these plans to start the school the beginning of the year.



Meet Our Friends from Montana Gala and Kevin Hill Mosby, Montana

Our friendship goes back to the time when Kevin was a young boy helping his dad with cattle

and sheep on their sprawling remote ranch. We recently had the opportunity to spend time with them during our tour in August with the Hein family. Kevin and Gala, as well as Kevin's parents, have been supportive of our ministry for decades and attended two of our concerts in rural America. After the second concert on a Sunday morning, they came to me and shared how the Lord had spoken to them to be a part in building our new Cayo School of Music and Arts in Belize.

They were especially excited to hear that they could receive a tax deductible receipt for their giving. Their concern was that last year, due to a family inheritance, they had paid a huge amount of taxes to the government. And they understood that it would not only be possible to give a generous amount towards the ministry of the school, but receive a tax deduction on their federal taxes.

The change breaker for them was when they heard their donation would be matched by a Christian rancher in Colorado. Which meant every dollar they donated would be matched or doubled.

This opportunity exists only until the end of the year for any of our friends or churches who give towards this project, knowing that each \$100, \$500, \$1,000 or more will be doubled by our rancher friend up to \$60,000.-. There are only 6 weeks for your giving to be doubled. All donations must be dated no later than December, 31, 2025.

As of now, we have been able to raise approximately 2/3 or \$40,000.- of our share of the matching challenge. But we are still not there yet, the other 1/3 or \$20,000 needs to be raised in the next 6 weeks.

This is a wonderful opportunity for your giving to make a difference by investing in this project of building a school of music and arts for the purpose of reaching children in the district of Cayo, Belize, through music, art and God's Word.
