Meeting Notes

Meeting was opened at 12:00 pm by John Etheridge. Kevin Casper offered prayer and followed with the Pledge of Allegiance. Approximately 18 members were in attendance including Board Members Mike Hopewell, Dennis Wade, & Roger Burrows...also Secretary Donnie Wheeler. Meeting was led by President John Etheridge.

July minutes were reviewed and approved.

Old Business:

John Etheridge discussed the positive growth beginning to get established on the berms. Clemson Extension recommended Fall seeding with Rye, followed by Bermuda in the spring as a permanent cover. Plan is to watch the growth over the next two hottest months and make the rye seeding decision when the cooler weather arrives. Dennis Wade reported that after the board approval he applied the recent White Tail Grant to purchase the used Chandelle thrower and this will be setup which will complete the expansion of the shotgun range. Dennis Wade also built a rotating steel target that will be setup at the 25-yard station on the rifle range. This is intended for pistol use only.

New Business

Kevin Casper has been the armorer for the club for the past 10 years. He is looking for someone else to step up and take the position. The armorer will be provided a large capacity safe that can hold all the club firearms. Also be willing to clean and maintain the inventory of 22 Caliber rifles. John requested an

inventory list of club owned firearms. As a side note we audit the asset ledger that lists all firearms. Search window for the next armorer is open.

John Etheridge, Harold Docherty, and Dennis Wade are designing and planning to develop a walking archery range through the woods. This is to encourage more archery at the range and to allow a realistic environment to develop members skills. Nick Carter will be the manager for the archery range. The general timeline is to have this plan implemented by March 2027. The board will be updated as the project comes together.

The group discussed extending Saturday morning for the monthly meetings. Dennis Wade made a motion seconded by Roger Burrows. The attendees voted to extend Saturday meetings thru December 2026. This is to encourage more member participation and shooting events prior to the meeting. May consider a meal at one of these meetings.

Dennis is discussing obtaining and applying more topsoil to the berms and will report to the board with an update.

Youth outreach volunteers was also discussed.

Reminder- Monthly meetings for September through December will be held on the 2nd Saturday. These meetings begin at noon.
