

JUDITH DIANNE JACKSON SCHOLARSHIP FUND 2020

"Go into the world and do well. But more importantly, go into the world and do good" ~ Minor Myers, Jr.

Judith Jackson dedicated her life to removing barriers for young people and helping them realize their greatness to pursue their dreams and impact their communities. She exemplified this dedication as she worked with Youth and Non-Profit agencies her entire life to impact under-served young men and women. Additionally, "Judy" served in many roles in civic organizations include stints as President of the National Association of Black Social Workers, President of the Detroit Association of Black Social Workers. She also served on the Boards of Plymouth Education Center Charter School, New Detroit and ARISE.

The Judith Jackson Scholarship Fund scholarship was established in 2015 to honor the life and legacy of a true champion of youth. The Judith Dianne Jackson Scholarship Fund (the "Scholarship") will provide \$1,000 annually toward tuition and/or related educational expenses (such as room, board, books) of an undergraduate program at a regionally accredited four-year-degree-granting college, university, a two-year community, junior college or skills trade school. The option of attending a two-year community or junior college must be part of an educational plan to continue a student's education at an accredited two or four-year college, university or training program and is not limited to colleges or universities located in the state of Michigan.

THE SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The scholarship awards will be issued by The Judith Dianne Jackson Scholarship Fund directly to the school or scholarship winners as appropriate.

The scholarship is renewable up to three times for a total of \$4,000 over four years of undergraduate study as long as the recipient maintains a GPA of 2.5 for the preceding scholastic year. If in the opinion of the Scholarship Committee, unusual and unexpected circumstances result in a scholarship recipient not reaching the 2.5 GPA, that requirement may be suspended following discussion with the Scholarship Committee and the scholarship recipient.

To be eligible for the renewal, it is expected that the scholarship recipients will file a report with The Judith Dianne Jackson Scholarship Fund at the end of each academic year (but no later than June 15) summarizing the scholarship recipient's college experience and to verify by submission of official transcripts that the recipient has met the criteria for continuation of the scholarship. At this point, the student must express intent to continue his/her college education for another year.

The application deadline is March 2, 2020.

ELIGIBILITY AND PREFERENCES

In order to be eligible for The Judith Dianne Jackson Scholarship, candidates must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Applicants must be in their senior year of high school planning to graduate by spring of 2020.
- 2. These scholarships will be awarded to the most deserving youth, following the guidelines described above, and based upon the selection criteria set forth below in the section "SELECTION OF WINNERS."
- 3. Applicant must be enrolled to begin study by fall of 2020 (proof of enrollment required).
- 4. Applicant must have a 2.5 GPA.

The application deadline is March 2, 2020. The application and supplemental attachments **MUST BE RECEIVED** by this date in order to meet the deadline. Only completed application packets will be considered for scholarship awards.

Please note the last section of the application is an **Application Checklist** provided to help you ensure your application has been completed correctly. Please be sure to proofread your entire application as presentation, sentence and paragraph structure, spelling and grammar do count.

SELECTION OF WINNERS

The Scholarship Selection Committee will select winners based on an evaluation of the complete application and the personal interviews with the finalists. The Committee will strongly consider academic achievements and credentials, such as the applicant's high school class rank, transcripts, GPA, curriculum and ACT or SAT scores. The Committee will also consider evidence of leadership qualities, extracurricular activities, community service, work experience outside of school, honors and awards, and recognition by his/her peers. The Committee will also evaluate the applicant's personal qualities, motivation and interests as demonstrated in the letters of recommendation and the personal essay.

All applicants will be notified of their status as either a finalist or no longer under consideration on or before **April 3, 2020**. Interviews with the finalists will be completed no later than **March 24, 2020** and will be conducted in person. The interviews, which are informal, will last approximately 30 minutes and are being conducted so the Scholarship Committee will have an opportunity to meet personally and get to know the applicant. Applicants should be prepared to share what they have learned about Judith Dianne Jackson and her contributions to the Youth of Detroit. The applicants will also be able to ask questions of the Scholarship Committee and make a final statement to the Scholarship Committee at the conclusion of the interview.

The Scholarship Committee, will make the final selection of winners. All finalists will be notified by telephone or email, on or before **April 3, 2020.**
