Here is an article found from the Oakville Milton Flying club on safety.

Please ensure all your planes, gliders, drones and copters have the MAAC identification requirement.

A reminder to mark your models, whether they be planes, foamies or drones according to the MAAC requirements. Not only is this a MAAC requirement, but also a condition of the Transport Canada exemption that MAAC members enjoy. The official document that covers this is MPPD 10 - Owner contact information on Model Aircraft. I believe a copy of this document was emailed to all MAAC members who have given MAAC their email addresses.

The pertinent information is below:

- A) Members MAAC number (required);
- B) MAAC, website address (required);
- C) MAAC office phone number "or" members home/cell phone number (required); and
- D) Members name (optional).
