In December, Sarah (name changed for confidentiality) was left with four young children to care for on her own. No job, no car—a difficult situation, to say the least. Very practical needs brought her to the Center, and since then, our staff and volunteers have been honored to transport much-needed items to her and help her find rent and utility assistance, providing extra support as she worked to get on her feet. Through hard work and the empowerment of a loving community, Sarah has secured a remote job and is taking business classes as she wants to start a small business someday. Things are looking bright for this family's future.

As I dropped off items, I got to know her, and she has been an absolute inspiration to me. She is a follower of Jesus and while the road has been rocky and given her many sleepless nights, she has steadfastly fixed her hope on Christ. In our many conversations, she shared with me that she longed for a church family. However, a lack of transportation prevented her from finding a church home.

Finding someone who lived near her and who had a vehicle large enough to hold four car seats and an additional adult was no small task. I asked our prayer team to ask God to make a way.

And God answered! We have connected Sarah with a family that supports the Center, and they take her and her kiddos to church weekly. The kids love Sunday School and Childrens' Church, and Sarah loves the teaching, worship, and community. This family even treated Sarah and her kids to a picnic at a local park after worship one Sunday afternoon.



You see, the Shenandoah County Pregnancy Center hopes not only to meet the pregnancy and parenting needs of our clients but, more importantly, to connect them with a local Church for ongoing life-on-life discipleship that they might choose Abundant Life.

Abundant Life happens in the small moments, as seen in Sarah's story. Moments when a local family adopts a mom and takes her family on a picnic. Or when the SCPC community drops off meals and supplies at her house. And when a church family opens its heart wide to a single mom and her children. Abundant life happens in moments of self-sacrificial love.

The cost of sacrificial love is exacting and will cost us our very selves. But in God's goodness and kindness, He has poured His love lavishly into our hearts through His Spirit, making us able to walk the path of Christ to become a gift of love to others. Through love, God redeems Shenandoah County.
