- 7. VPP Element-Worksite Analysis- Alex Miller
 - a. What is success? Great communication, ability to stop jobs, etc...
 - b. Heinrich's accident pyramid
 - i. Led to extensive focus on hazard analysis and safety practices.
 - ii. Supports hindsight bias and lagging indicators.
 - iii. Successful in lowering rates of injury and fatalities but not to 0.
 - c. Complexity
 - i. Murphys Law-Whatever can go wrong will go wrong.
 - ii. Our work is complex, we put up defenses but are they enough to capture every possible scenario?
 - d. Hazard analysis
 - i. Starts with work planning.
 - ii. What permitting is required?
 - iii. How do we communicate.
 - iv. Do we use work permitting.
 - v. STCKY (Stuff That Could Kill You) If your job includes these things consider having a deeper conversation before starting work (LOTO, lifting and rigging, excavation trenching, energized electrical work, transfer of chemicals)
 - e. Contractor Management
 - i. It isn't us vs. them. We are the key to their success and they are the key to our success.
 - ii. Don't skimp or skip traditional tools from day to day when contractors are involved.
 - iii. Challenge contractors to think outside of the box.
 - iv. Communicate! Listen to and value input from contractors.

- v. Value get it right vs get it done.
- vi. Stop work triggers, what are they? Does everyone feel comfortable using this tool?
- vii. As important as stopping work is when do we restart work? Is everyone clear are all the questions answered?
- viii. Consider pushing the limits of good and reach excellence by inquiring further a good example being industrial hygiene in regard to work contractors may be completing.
