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Submission Guidelines

Length:

250–300 words, excluding the title, author names, and affiliations.

Required Structure:

- **Title:** Concise and informative.
- **Background/Introduction:** Provide context, identify the gap in existing knowledge, or outline the rationale for the study.
- **Methods:** Summarise the study design, techniques, or analytical approach used.
- **Results:** Highlight the main findings or preliminary data if the work is ongoing.
- **Conclusion:** Present the key outcomes, implications, or next steps.

Key Dates:

- **Submission deadline:** 28 November 2025, 17:00 (UK time)
- **Results announced:** 1 December 2025

Formatting Requirements:

Use Arial (11 pt) or Times New Roman (12 pt) font, single-spaced.

Submit as a PDF document.

Include author affiliations and clearly indicate the presenting author.

Language: Abstracts must be submitted in English.

Ethical Considerations:

All submissions must comply with ethical research standards. Ensure that appropriate approvals and permissions such as patient consent are in place prior to submission.

Medical Students

Eligibility:

Open to current undergraduate and postgraduate medical students who have not yet completed their medical degree. Submissions are welcome from applicants worldwide.

Focus:

Abstracts may present original research, case reports, or literature reviews related to any aspect of surgery. Contributions highlighting innovation, technological development, or emerging trends in surgical practice whether exploratory or established are strongly encouraged.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Originality: Demonstrates creativity, novelty, or innovative thinking in surgical concepts or techniques.
- Scientific Rigor: Employs sound methodology and logical analysis.
- Presentation: Clear, well-structured, and compliant with formatting requirements.
- Relevance: Addresses important issues or contributes meaningfully to clinical practice or surgical education.



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Post-Medical School Professionals

Eligibility:

Open to foundation doctors, residents, and qualified medical professionals who have completed medical school.

Focus:

Submissions should center on advanced clinical or technical research within the field of surgery. Projects may present comprehensive findings, applied clinical studies, or practice-oriented innovations that demonstrate depth and relevance to surgical advancement.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Clinical Impact: Significance and applicability of the work to surgical practice.
- Methodological Strength: Quality, rigor, and validity of the study design and analysis.
- Innovation: Introduction of new techniques, methods, or technologies in surgery.
- Professional Contribution: Potential to shape future developments in surgical care, training, or education.



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
