Let us now see how He has used this light to reveal where we are and where we are going.

1. What has God given man to guide him in this age? 2 Peter 1:19 -
Through what agent does God communicate His secrets to mankind? Amos 3:7 -
Read: Daniel chapter 2. You will notice that God communicated with King Nebuchadnezzar, ruler of the mighty Babylonian Empire. Through a dream, God outlined the future to this king. Notice how God used Daniel.
 Why should this dream be so important to us living in earth's final hours? Daniel 2:28 -
4. Who did Daniel say could reveal the dream to the king? Daniel 2:27-28 -
5. What had the king seen in his dream? Daniel 2:31-36 -
6. Who did Daniel say would interpret the dream for the king? Daniel 2:28, 30 & 36 -
7. What was represented by the head of gold of the image? Daniel 2:37-38

Note: Babylon, was one of the wonders of the ancient world. With it's magnificent display of wealth, it's beautiful buildings and luxuriant gardens, it was indeed the capital of the ancient golden kingdom.

8. How would the second kingdom, Medo-Persia, compare to Babylon?

Daniel 2:39 -

Note: God told Belshazzar that the Babylonians were to be succeeded by the Medes and Persians. **Daniel 5:25-31**

9. What part of the metal man represented the third kingdom of Greece?

Daniel 2:39 -

Note: "The battles of Granicus, B.C. 334, Issus, in the following year, and Arbella in B.C. 331, settled the fate of the Persian Empire, and established the wide dominion of the Greeks." *The Divine Program of the World's History*, by H. Grattan Guinness, page 308.

10. The fourth world empire, Rome, is represented by the legs of what?

Daniel 2:40 -

Note: Through this dream, God outlines the history of this world from the days of Nebuchadnezzar to the end of time. He reveals four world empires in succession. History reveals they were: Babylon (head of gold), Medo-Persia (chest and arms of silver), Greece (thighs of brass), and Rome (legs of iron), which was divided as represented by the feet of iron and clay.

"...and the images of gold, silver, brass and iron that represent the nations and their kings were successively broken ." (paraphrase) Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire, Chap.38, par 1., by Gibbon.

11. As the feet, part iron and part clay, represented a divided condition, what was to happen to the iron kingdom of Rome? **Daniel 2:41** -

Note: Between the years 351-476 A.D., a series of invasions by barbaric tribes from northern Europe completely overran the Roman Empire and brought it to it's end. These tribes included: **Saxons** (English), **Franks** (French), **Alemanni** (German), **Burgundians** (Swiss), **Lombards** (Italians), **Visigoths** (Spanish), **Suevi** (Portugese), **Vandals**, **Ostrogoths**, and **Heruli**.

12. What statement shows that the old world empires would never be welded back into one great kingdom? **Daniel 2:43** -

13. Who is to set up a world kingdom in the days of the kings represented by the feet of iron and clay? **Daniel 2:44-45** -

14. When will Christ set up this kingdom? **Matthew 25:31-34** -
