When Christ began His ministry in Jerusalem, one of the first things he did was to drive the money changers out of the temple. We find that three and a half years later, as he neared the end of His ministry, the money changers had returned to the temple. The Bible says "Jesus went into the temple of God and cast out all of them that sold and bought in the temple, and overthrew the tables of the money changers, and the seats of them that sold doves. And said unto them, It is written, My house shall be called a house of prayer, but ye have made it a den of thieves." **Matthew 21:12-13.**

If Jesus were to visit many churches today He would say the same thing that He did 2000 years ago. Not long ago a newspaper told about a pastor of a large church in Montana who found himself short of funds to operate his church. He devised a most ingenious scheme to raise the needed funds. He had raffle tickets printed and sold chances on a case of 90% proof whisky. Some good member of his church, after having been taught how to gamble by his minister, would be the proud possessor of a case of whisky by which he could become intoxicated. Some religionists defend such practices by saying they are necessary in order to finance the giving of the gospel.
