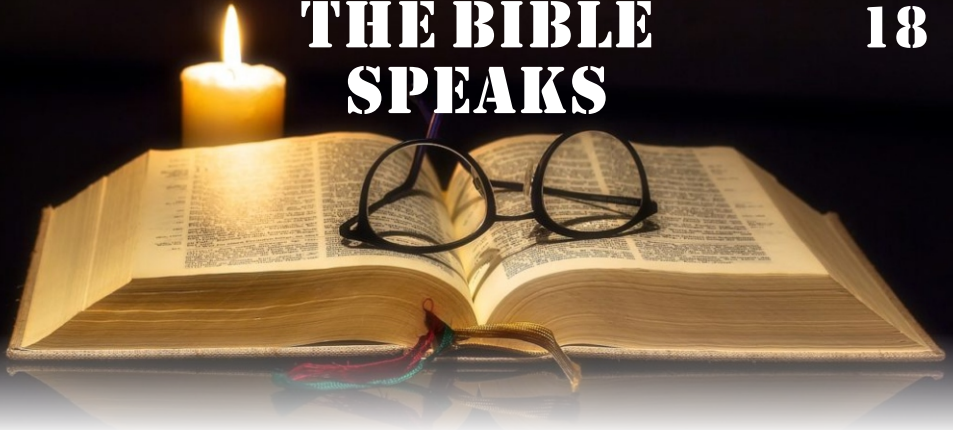

Is God Really Particular?

Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus

Philippians Chapter 2 verse 5

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While talking with her minister, a lady said, "I know that I am not doing what I should, but God will understand. I am certain that He will overlook the little sins that I do as long as I am sincere." This seems to be the attitude of many professed Christians today. They are in effect saying by their actions that God is not particular, that He winks at sin as long as the person professes to be sincere in his sin. The Bible talks about God saving His people from their sins, but there is no place in which it speaks about Him saving them in their sins. The Bible teaches that God has certain laws in the universe and that these laws are in existence to protect the freedom of His creatures. These laws exist because God saw that the violation of these principles would bring sickness, sorrow, and death to those who violated them. In **Proverbs 16:25** Solomon said, "There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death."

The man who drinks arsenic, thinking that it is cough syrup, will be just as dead as the man who drinks arsenic with the knowledge that it is poison. What a man thinks does not change the substance of what he drinks. Because a person thinks that wrong is right, it does not follow that wrong becomes right. It is true that God has in times past overlooked some of the wrong acts of mankind, but now He has given man enough light so that there is no excuse for sin. Jesus said to the Pharisees, "If ye were blind ye should have no sin; but now ye say, we see: therefore your sin remaineth." Paul in **Acts 17:30** states that in the times of man's ignorance God over-looked his sinful behaviour, but now He commands him to repent.
