As God brought the people of Israel out of bondage in Egypt, He became their King and Leader. As the people multiplied and were established in the land of Palestine, they wanted to be like the nations around them. They asked God to give them a human king. God granted their request and allowed Saul to become their first king. Saul was a very religious young man and prophesied after becoming king. For a short period of time he was a good king, but pride and stubbornness caused him to ignore God's instructions and follow his own wilful way. When God told him to utterly destroy the Amalekites and all that they possessed, he only partially obeyed. Samuel came out to meet the victorious Saul and his army. When asked why he had failed to do all that God had commanded, Saul blamed the people for his own rebellion. By little acts of disobedience Saul had been laying the foundation for this final act of rebellion against God. Not only did God reject Saul from being king over Israel, but the Bible tells us that God withdrew His Spirit from Saul and he became a lost man, beyond the help and forgiveness of God. Saul was lost eternally!

Notice what the Bible says about him in **1 Samuel 16:1**, "But the spirit of the Lord departed from Saul." Without the help of the Holy Spirit, there was no hope for Saul. The Bible speaks about the danger of sinning so long that forgiveness is no longer desired. Some have called this act the "Unpardonable Sin." Let us find what the Bible has to say about this sin.

Note: Jesus taught that the work of the Holy Spirit is to bring the sinner a conviction of sin that he might feel his need of salvation. The Holy Spirit will bring conviction and lead to the conversion of every person who truly desires to be saved, but He will not force a person to become a Christian. The still small voice of the Spirit will woo the sinner to Christ. Without the working of this power the sinner will have no desire to come and confess his sins and receive cleansing. The Holy Spirit will be withdrawn from the sinner when he stubbornly turns a deaf ear to this voice which would guide him into all truth. By a continual refusal to respond to the leading of the Holy Spirit, the sinner will harden his heart and be past feeling. King David was afraid that the Holy Spirit had been taken from him when he committed a terrible sin. David prayed that God would completely cleanse him and not take His Spirit away from him (**Psalm 51**). When the voice of God speaks to us through His Word or Spirit, let us not reject His leading, let us respond by eagerly following Him.
