Note: The money we decide to give to others should be considered as a gift, not a loan. Therefore we should make sure that we can afford to give such a gift in case there is no repayment.

Note: The "first fruits" refers to the practice of giving to God's use the first and best portion of the harvest. (Deuteronomy 26:9-11) Many people give God their leftovers. If they can afford to donate anything, they do so. These people may be sincere and contribute willingly, but their attitude is nonetheless backward. We need to give God the first part of our income. This demonstrates that God, not possessions, have first place in our lives and that our resources belong to him and that we are only managers of God's resources. Giving to God first helps us to conquer greed, helps us to properly manage God's resources, and opens us up to receive God's special blessings.

Note: The people of Malachi's day ignored God's command to give a tithe of their income to His temple. They may have feared losing what they had worked so hard to get, but in this they misjudged God.
