Bark For Your Park

In August, LeClaire was selected as one of 30 finalists for a PetSafe Bark for Your Park grant contest. The grant, which awards prizes totaling \$150,000 to 10 communities has donated more than \$1.5 million to support more than 70 off-leash dog parks in the United States. During the whole month of August, U.S. residents 18 and over could vote once per day, every day for their favorite community at barkforyourpark.com. To encourage voting, some local LeClaire businesses were offering incentives to customer with proof of vote.

"As LeClaire's Parks & Recreation Commission, we believe it is our mission to

provide beautiful recreational and green spaces for our citizens, including the furry ones," said Lauren Friedenberg, chair of the LeClaire Parks & Recreation Commission. "By voting for LeClaire to receive the PetSafe Bark for Your Park grant, you will help LeClaire build the dog park of our dreams."

Finalists were chosen from a panel of PetSafe judges that scored each submission on the level of enthusiasm and support for a dog park project within the community and the impact the park project will have on the community. Winners were announced in September. Although LeClaire was not selected in the final round of grants, they will continue applying for grants to support park and recreation development in LeClaire.





Great River Rumble

Sunday, August 1st, in Mud Lake Park, Iowa, kayakers and canoers started their week-long float down the Mississippi River to end up in LeClaire, Iowa.

They traveled about 92 miles down the majestic river. Each day they paddled through the river's sloughs and backwaters, and sometimes the main channel. They had to pass through several locks as well. Each day boaters would stop at small river towns and enjoy food specials and sometimes entertainment!

They ended their float with a Farewell Celebration Banquet at the Isle Casino Hotel in Bettendorf.

Tug Fest was back in full force this year after having to cancel last year due to Covid-19, August 12-14! The Iowa Tug Fest Theme for 2021 was "Peace, Love and Tug Fest", and the 2021 Tug for A Cause was the Riverbend Food Bank. Riverbend is the largest hunger-relief organization in Eastern Iowa/Western Illinois distributing more than 2 million meals! Thank you to all who supported the Food Bank by purchasing a 2021 Tug Fest t-shirt. Two dollars from every t-shirt sale was donated to the Riverbend Food Bank.

For 35 years, LeClaire, IA and Port Byron, IL have hosted and competed in a 3-day event that is unlike any other festival. Within those 3 days, both cities pack in plenty of entertainment with things like; a 5-k Tug Run, carnival rides, fair food, live bands, spectacular fireworks, a grand parade, and the one-and-only Tug Fest. Saturday, August 14th, eleven teams of tuggers, competed from the levees of LeClaire and Port Byron and people from all over came to support their favorite teams.

Illinois was once again the winner of the Alabaster Eagle trophy, with a final result of 3-8. Thank you to all who tugged this year for lowa and Illinois, we couldn't be more proud!

Reflections of Early Chamber Years


If my memory serves me, I became Chamber president in the early 1980's following Founder and first President, Bud deSilva. I apologize if these dates are wrong, but I think we found my successor from a noon chamber meeting on my boat near the dry stack marina. No one on board could think of a candidate until we encountered grocer, Paul Slagle, sailing across our bow on a small sunfish sailboat. I said, "That's Paul Slagle; our next chamber president, let's ask him." Paul agreed to serve for one or two years. I had served for several years as president and stayed on the board for many years thereafter. I believe I served every office but secretary.

One of the fun things we created was a welcoming committee called first mates. We dressed in a quasi-uniform with navy blue blazers and gray slacks wearing first mate name tags. In addition to ribbon cuttings, in the late 1980's our committee hosted a historic homes tour of all of the captain's homes on the national register. One year, my wife, Ann (who chaired first mates), and I staffed the Gamble Mansion on Wisconsin street. It was Mother's Day and the Quad-City Times gave a large write-up in the Sunday paper. The town was inundated with history buffs, and I could not believe our site hosted several hundred guests over a three hour-time.

We tried any ideas we could to market our historic town. Eventually with the help and vision of realtors, local business people, and the city's financial assistance, the town's potential grew to what you enjoy today!

Huckleberry Park Ribbon Cutting

On Sunday, September 12, almost 50 people gathered to celebrate the official opening of LeClaire's newest park located by the LeClaire water tower. Huckleberry Park represents years of planning by the City's Parks and Recreation Commission as part of their comprehensive plan. Amy Blair,

LeClaire City Council, recognized commission members for their work in creating the park which included applying for and receiving several grants. The park has playground equipment for all ages, a hiking trail, soccer fields, four pickleball courts, picnic shelter with kitchen and restrooms. Watch for more developments in Spring of 2022 including expansion of the hiking trail. Parks and Recreation Commission will host another event to celebrate the completion of this next phase of work for Huckleberry Park.

Members of the Quad-Cities Pickleball Club joined the celebration, including incoming President Steve Morrison, to congratulate the Commission members on the beautiful new pickleball courts. A pick-up game followed the celebration with Mayor Ray Allen picking up a racquet.

Lauren Friedenberg, Chair of the Parks and Recreation Commission was recognized for her leadership and instrumental work in creating Huckleberry Park. Lauren's last day on the commission was September 12 as she and her family are moving from LeClaire. Thank you, Lauren, Amy, and all of the Parks and Recreation Commission members and volunteers for your work in making recreational spaces available for people of all ages in LeClaire!





9/11 Memorial

On Saturday, September 11, LeClaire firefighters and volunteers celebrated the completion of the 9/11 World Trade Center Memorial located on the east side of the Fire Department. The Fire Department became the proud custodian of an artifact from the World Trade Center in 2011. It is one of only two entities in lowa which has one, and it is the only artifact in Scott County.

The memorial features an I-beam from one of the World Trade Center Towers, overlooked by a 7-foot statue of a firefighter and two standing 8-foot walls symbolizing the World Trade Center. The beam had been on display in the station's museum and is now on permanent display for the community and public to view and reflect on the sacrifice and tragedy of September 11.

"Now, people can touch it, they can feel it, they can look a little closer," firefighter Nick McManus said of the memorial. "I remember the arrival of the I-beam ten years ago when the parade passed by our home and we followed it to City Hall for a somber recognition of the events of September 11," Kathy Anderson reflected. "Ten years later, my granddaughter stood at the fire station on Saturday morning to wave our flags as the procession left the LeClaire fire station and traveled to each fire station in Scott County." The procession then returned to LeClaire for a 5:00 pm dedication ceremony.

Fundraising for this project is ongoing. A GoFundMe page has been organized by the LeClaire Firefighters Association, to raise the remaining funds for the memorial.
