


ACR Mission:

No Suprises Act - Goals

- Patient held harmless
- Reimbursement Model \rightarrow Arbitration



IDR Criteria – No Surprises Act (NSA)

- Training, Experience, quality, and outcomes
- Market share of parties
- Acuity of patients/complexity of cases
- Teaching status, case mix, scope of services of facility
- Good faith efforts by the parties to contract
- Contracting rate history from last four years
- QUALIFYING PAYMENT AMOUNT
- Cannot Consider:
 - Billed Charges (ie too high)

NSA – Interim Final Rule

- Rulemaking by Administration operationalizes the law...
- Median In Network Rate Each Contracted Rate a 'Data Point'
- Rulemaking "Certified IDR entity must begin with the presumption that the QPA is the appropriate out of network rate (and) must select the offer closest to the QPA'

Medical Community Response – Lots of Lawsuits

- TMA → "Rebuttable Presumption"
 - Judge Agreed Not in law
 - Vacated that portion of the rule
 - Administration removed that portion of law
 - Administration appealed last minute
 - Awaiting Final Rule
- ACR/ACEP/ASA
 - Case Stayed by Judge
 - Pending Final Rule



NSA → Current Status

- Final Rule Pending
- Areas of Current Concern
 - Abusive payer behavior
 - Administrative burdens
 - Mandatory negotiation period
- ACR needs your help \rightarrow Every practice at risk



• Future Focus Points

- Reduced imaging reimbursement
 - Federal Government (Medicare)
 - Continued Monitoring of No Surprises Act Implementation
 - IDR lawsuits (Texas, AMA/AHA, ACEP/ACR/ASA)
- Scope Issues
 - Non-Physician Providers (NPPs) seeking more traditional physician responsibilities and greater independence from supervisory requirements
 - Will require increased state GR activity
- Artificial Intelligence (AI)
 - Continuing to lead the debate on how best to utilize AI in imaging

Focus Areas – CPT, Relative Value Scale Update Committee (RUC), and the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule

ACR

- **Purpose:** To create and value new, revised and existing codes.
- **Goal:** To obtain accurate and appropriate reimbursement rates.
- Meets 3 times a year



2022 - ACR action saved radiology approximately \$1.2 billion

- Ami Bera, MD and Larry Buchson, MD co-sponsors
- Increase the Medicare conversion factor rate for physicians by 3.75% in calendar year 2021 and by 3% in 2022.
- Push into 2023 the statutory pay-as-you-go (PAYGO) requirement balances that would have triggered 4% funding cuts this year
- Suspend a 2% Medicare payment cut required under the 2011 Budget Control Act (referred to as "sequester cuts") for all of 2021
- In 2022, the 2% sequester cuts are suspended through March 31, then reduced from 2% to 1% for the next three months, through June 30. The 2% sequester cuts are then scheduled to be fully implemented on July 1

2023 Medicare Physician Fee Schedule

- 2023 Proposed Conversion Factor: \$33.0775
 - 2022 Conversion Factor is \$34.6062
 - Negative 1.55% budget neutrality update due to increases in values for some E/M codes, expiration of one year 3% bump passed by Congress for 2022
- Year 2 of Clinical Labor Wage Update
 - Direct practice expense contains 3 components: medical supplies, equipment and clinical labor, all of which must be "budget neutral" to each other
 - CMS recently updated the clinical labor wage data component of direct practice expense, which led to a significant code level reduction to medical supplies and equipment heavy codes
 - CMS transitioned the increases and corresponding decreases beginning 1/1/2022. The 4-year phase-in ends in 2025.

Clinical Decision Support for Medicare

What is the Medicare Clinical Decision Support (CDS)/Appropriateness Use Criteria (AUC) \land requirement?

Effective January 1, 2018, the Protecting Access to Medicare Act (PAMA) will require referring providers to consult AUC before ordering advanced diagnostic imaging services (ADIS) — CT, MR, nuclear medicine and PET — for Medicare patients. Regulations are to be issued by Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) later this year.

2022 AMA Resolution 211

"Our AMA will advocate to Congress and CMS to <u>delay implementation</u> of and advance modifications to the Medicare AUC Program in such a manner that...<u>adequately addresses</u> technical and workflow <u>challenges that add to clinician's</u> <u>administrative burden and practice expenses</u>..."

$CDS \rightarrow A New Deal?$





Employers Are Seeking Fellowship-Trained New Hires






Survey Feedback on Procedure Skill Set Requirements and Preferences



Fewer than Half of respondents require and/or prefer specific procedural knowledge

- Of those who indicate a preference/requirement regarding procedural knowledge
 - More than **7** in **10** (73%) indicate <u>DR-Level Interventions</u> are required or preferred
 - Nearly 4 in 10 (39%) indicated a requirement/preference for Basic IR Procedures
 - And fewer than 1 in 10 (8%) required/preference for Advanced IR procedures
 - Open Ended responses indicate that had *Breast Procedures* been included in the procedure list it would have matched the response rate for *Advanced IR Procedures* (8%)




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














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
