Weekly Devotion....

Doing it Right!

Genesis 13:1-18

January 29, 2026

Our Bible has a number of dysfunctional families with negative examples of how to resolve conflicts. Jacob's clear preference for his son Joseph. Absalom's revolt against his father, King David. Herod's murder of one of his wives and one of his sons. Look around and you'll find plenty more.

Today's Scripture Lesson provides us with an example of a family in conflict, but who is doing it right.

At God's command, Abraham and his wife Sarah have left their home in Ur in Chaldea (modern Iraq). Abraham's nephew, Lot, went with them. By stages, they made their way up along the fertile crescent to what is now Israel. Despite some setbacks, everyone has prospered. In fact, they are now too prosperous! Abraham has a lot of livestock and herdsmen to look after. Lot, too, has abundant livestock and herdsmen. But water and grazing land are scarce. There's not enough for both herds and the herdsmen are beginning to fight each other.

Abraham assumes the responsibility of resolving the conflict before it can get out of hand. Instead of arguing or claiming the privileges of being older, instead of threatening or trying to intimidate, Abraham offers Lot a deal. He tells Lot to take his herds, his herdsmen, his family, his possessions, everything he has and go his own way. "We're family. We shouldn't be fighting. You go your way and I'll make sure to stay away from you, giving you plenty of room to expand your holdings."

Looking to the east, Lot sees the fertile land around the Jordan River and decides to move there. Abraham settles for the arid region to the west.

At first glance, it seems Abraham has gotten a raw deal. *'That's what you get for being magnanimous!'* But God has promised to bless Abraham, and God can bless us anywhere. God promises Abraham that he and his descendants, despite the poor land, will prosper right where they are.

Lot took the good land, but before long he would flee with little more than the clothes on his back. Abraham, living in a semi-desert, grows in wealth and power.

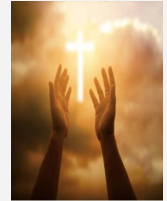
There are times when separating is the right thing to do. Families, social groups, the company we work for, the family business, even our church; for whatever reason, remaining together is untenable. When that happens, let's recall Abraham and Lot's arrangement. There's no need for acrimony, name-calling and hard feelings. Let's simply each agree to go our own way, knowing that God has promised to be with us and love us wherever we are, even a semi-desert.

2026 PER CAPITA REMINDER

As a member of First Presbyterian Church, we are required by the Presbytery of Whitewater Valley to pay annual per capita dues each year per member. **For 2026, that amount is \$46.02 per member.** The per capita is our shared gift providing primary support of the operating ministry of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly. These are dues that we are required to pay and it is an **expense that equates to approximately \$12,000 each year from our operating budget** receiving only about 25% from members. We pay these dues in March whether the money has been received by our members or not. **If you could faithfully pay your portion of the per capita by March 1st, that would be greatly appreciated.** If you have any questions, please feel free to ask Robin.

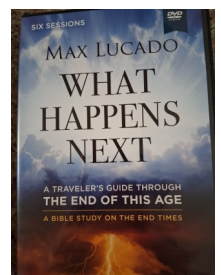

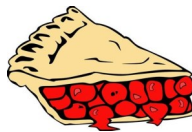
