The HENDERSON SETTLEMENT WORK CAMP mission trip is a First Presbyterian Church sponsored WORK TRIP, BUT THE WORK LOAD IS LIGHT FOR PERSONS WITH LIMITED PHYSICAL STRENGTH AND ENDURANCE.

The cost for the trip is \$257.25 (10.18-22) or \$319.75 (10.18-23), plus transportation (carpooling). Proof of personal medical insurance and trip fees are required with the application.

Henderson Settlement (Frakes, Kentucky), is a mountain outreach ministry of the Red Bird Missionary Conference of the United Methodist Church. The Settlement has a number of outreach and construction ministries where volunteers are needed.

The 2026-2 FPC Work Team at Henderson Settlement is housed in the 4 cottages and Zoochi House.

Twin or double beds (no bunk beds) in small bedrooms with bedding, pillows, towels and minimal

personal hygiene items (soap) furnished. There are hot showers in each cottage. Cottages have a single bathroom.

Work Campers are to bring all clothing, shoes (no open-toed shoes), hat, gloves, sunscreen, bug spray, etc. No laundry facilities are available on campus.

Team members are invited to bring coffee, snacks, bottled water, soft drinks, cookies and candy. There are coffee pots and a refrigerator in each unit. There is WiFi in every building (ChristAlive25 is the password), but no cell service anywhere on campus. There are 3 US Watts telephone lines available to work campers in the dorm basement during evening hours. Ear plugs are suggested. There is a Gift Shop in the dorm basement selling local made mountain crafts that will be open on a limited basis. The Community Store is open to all. No music devices are allowed unless using earphones.
