



Addition to Our Veterans' Day Observance...



FPC has a great tradition of honoring our veterans. This year, that will be during the morning worship on Sunday, November 9. There will be an addition to that observance this year. *Immediately following the worship service, in the fellowship hall, each veteran will be awarded a Quilt of Valor!*


A Quilt of Valor is a patriotic quilt awarded to service members and veterans as a means to thank them for their service to our country. Quilts of Valor was begun in 2003 by a quilter whose son was serving a third tour in Iraq at that time. Since then, over 400,000 QOV's have been awarded in our country, Iraq, Afghanistan, and Germany.

This is being brought to your attention now as there is a way the congregation can be involved. Donations are needed to cover the cost of materials and machine quilting. That cost is \$150 for each quilt, a total of \$1800 for our twelve veterans. Those donations can be placed in the offering plate on a Sunday morning or sent to the church office, with a QOV designation. Any donations beyond the actual cost will be used for a project of the Session's choosing.

We're hoping our entire congregation, family members, and friends will be present for both the worship service and the Quilt of Valor ceremony.
