For eighteen years he volunteered as an assistant chaplain with the Hamilton County Sheriff's Department. He served as a volunteer with the former Hamilton County Crisis Response Team, the Indiana Crisis Assistance Response Team (I-CART), and the American Red Cross Spiritual Response Team [trained in Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM), National Community Crisis Response, and Psychological First Aid].

Derek received his Master of Divinity in 1993 from Asbury Theological Seminary.

Since 2002 Derek has served as the Director of Chaplaincy Services at Riverview Health.
