



THOROUGHLY EQUIPPED

I wonder if you have ever felt ill-equipped for something you felt God leading you into. Perhaps a new role at church, an opportunity to serve in your community, or a relationship that needed your time and care.

As I reflect on my own life, I can recall many moments like this. One example was when I felt God leading me to become part of the KYB production team for CWCI International. I didn't feel like an obvious fit for the role or confident in the skills required. Still, I tentatively followed God's promptings and applied for the job. And 3 years later, I can see how God prepared me for the role in ways I hadn't realised.

That experience has led me to think more about how we are equipped for the work God has for us. How do we prepare for roles or acts of service that God might lead us into? How can we be ready to step out in faith when he opens a door?

Some verses I have found helpful in answering these questions are 2 Timothy 3:16-17:

"All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

The last phrase — "thoroughly equipped for every good work" — suggests God has provided us with something that will equip and prepare us for his work, whatever that might be. It's not a partial equipping, such that he leaves the rest for us to figure out ourselves.

Rather, God promises to "thoroughly" equip us, or in other words, equip us completely! What a gracious and powerful God we serve!

And what has he provided for us? What makes it possible for us to be "thoroughly equipped for every good work"?

Verse 16 tells us God has given us the Scriptures — precious words directly from him, and wholly useful for us. Words that teach us, rebuke us, correct us, and train us in righteousness; words that powerfully transform us into who God wants us to be; words that instruct us in the right way to live, whatever situation we find ourselves in.

This is God's method of equipping his servants for his work: not by giving us every skill in advance, but by transforming us through his word. And the more we ground ourselves in his word — day by day, year after year — the more we grow in readiness for the good works he has prepared for us. And when the time comes for us to step forward in faith, we can do so with confidence — not in our own abilities — but in his promise to provide all that we need.

Let's thank God again for the blessing of KYB studies, which help us to know and be transformed by God's word. May God continue to thoroughly equip us for every good work, as we study his word together.

International Board News

2026 marks the start of a new three-year term for the International Board.

We welcome Susanna West as our new President, Jenny Callar as Finance Director and Liz Skilbeck as the new ANMB President. It was a delight to meet in person last September and to both welcome Susanna and Jenny, and farewell Sandra, Cecily and Chris Keith, the departing ANMB President. This has facilitated a smooth transition and IB has started the new year strongly. Susanna and Jenny are settling into their roles and it is a joy to support them along the way. The Lord has answered many prayers, allowing us to continue the work of producing KYB studies and facilitating the use of KYB in other countries.

The changes to the translation ministry required much prayer as IB sought to clarify how to continue to minister to people in other countries interested in studying the Bible using KYB. As IB no longer produces translations of KYB studies, English studies will be made available to those who wish to have them translated in their own country.

Requests for translated and English studies, as well as enquiries about starting a KYB study group, continue to be received from various parts of the world. A new position on the Board has therefore been created – the KYB Global Ministry Director – to respond to such enquiries from countries other than Australia, New Zealand, and the United Kingdom. For example, a group which began in Malaysia in recent years has divided and multiplied so there are now more than nine groups meeting regularly. The KYB Global Ministry Director will liaise with such groups and also oversee and encourage any approved translation work.
