



Crooked Paths

KYB is all about loving and living the word of God. Yet so many find it hard to get into and understand – don't we all at times? Recently I've come across two quotes which have stuck with me and have been playing about in my mind and heart.

They are from:

John Piper: "God wrote a book, that really blows me away every time I stop to think about it. Pages and pages of God. His thoughts, His words, His heart – right there, just a few inches away."

Richard Forster: "It's a wonder to me how God uses squiggles on paper to do the work in the hearts and minds of people."

These took me first to Ecclesiastes 7:13, "accept the way God does things, for who can straighten what He has made crooked?"

Many of God's people in this book are taken on 'crooked' paths. Things weren't straightforward, not tidy, not overly understandable.

Joseph with his pit to prison to palace
– Moses and God's people wandering
in the wilderness – Job – Daniel – Jesus
Himself and the cross – many more! Such
storylines can make us question at times
what God is doing. Twisted journeys, visible
and laid bare for all to see: the world
watching, seeing what is going on in us.

It is hard to realise God is still making a straight path of it all. Straight in this Hebrew context means direct, upright, true, straightforward, against the meaning of crooked being awry, out of shape or place, twisted.

So even in all our life situations, just like these Bible characters, there are answers and comforts from others' lives in God's word that make sense or give us courage to press on. Even when the path seems crooked with the twists and turns that life brings, His plan is still good. He can still be trusted for these truths are certainties when life seems uncertain. Or, we could say like these quotes, there are straight lines when the squiggles on paper are all curved and crooked. God is writing straight with crooked lines in our lives. No other book, self-help or otherwise, can give us promises or such hope.

Why is that? Because it's all about Jesus.

Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not unto your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight." Or, Isaiah 45:2, "I will go before you and make the crooked places straight." We don't have to understand the whys of God's ways, but we do have to choose to follow Him at times without the details. He is the only One who can write straight out of crooked lines. So when the way doesn't seem straight, remember as someone said "she survived every hard day, because God helped her, because God held her, and because God healed her heart". This reality is what we have for our own lives and to offer in KYB through this book.

This year four of the Australian Support Committee (ASC) visited Uganda to celebrate 30 years of partnership with BCC Uganda. It was a time of joy, celebration, a thanksgiving service and meeting with staff and students.

I would like to thank CWCI for their encouragement and support in sourcing KYB material to take to Uganda. For five years I have led a KYB group at my church and found the studies really useful. We are growing in our understanding of our faith and walk with Jesus through the lessons and are frequently challenged, but this is a blessing. It is for this reason and appreciation of KYB material that I wanted to share the studies with our Christian brothers and sisters at BCC.

We took one printed copy of the leader's guide (an Easy English study) and one of the study book, as well as a USB with the PDF on it, plus instructions which we also explained to them. This is a new concept of Bible study which we hope they will embrace when they have the time to organise a regular meeting. We suggested that the staff gathering held each morning

before commencing work might be a good time. This worship and Bible study time is called 'Morning Glory'. It is a wonderful way to start the day in a Christian organisation, and I have always loved participating when I am visiting.

We presented the KYB material in the library (see photo). I am on the left showing the hard copies to Fatina, the Chaplain and Bessie (right), one of the Child Care workers. The socked feet are young students sitting on a mat; they take their shoes off as it is very dusty or muddy outside!

We communicate regularly with BCC staff and hope to have some news from them later in the year regarding their progress with the KYB study.


Musings of a first-time writer Beth Allison

My first response to being asked to write a KYB study was that I felt inadequate for the task. It's interesting how we are tempted to shy away from challenges that are outside our experience and comfort zone.

But the timing was actually perfect. It was May 2020 and we were now in full Melbourne Covid lockdown. The brief was "to choose nine prayers from the Old Testament." But where should I start? What prayers best lent themselves to a KYB study? The selection process actually took several months, with much prayer, advice and lots of coffee. I had studied Old Testament history in the past, but realised I needed to refresh my understanding of events, people and places if I was going to do justice to why people prayed the prayers they did.

For nearly two years I immersed myself in the life of nine amazing Old Testament characters. What struck me was that although they belonged to a totally different time and culture, the cries of their heart were the same as ours. Where is God in my pain? Can God ever forgive me? How bold can I be in my prayers on behalf of others? When I at last emailed off my final draft to the editing team I felt I was farewelling nine dear friends.

Then began the wait for feedback from the team and the pilot groups. It reminded

Three years and nine months after I commenced writing Ancient prayers for modern people - Prayers of the Old Testament, I held in my hand the completed Study Book and Leader's Guide. It was a moment of deep gratitude for the privilege of being asked to write a KYB study. But above all, it was a moment of thankfulness to God for the way the study had challenged me personally as to the power and priority of prayer.
