LYMMO COMING TO THORNTON PARK

Free bus service is coming to Thornton Park in May. Orlando's Lynx public transit system is expanding the free downtown Lymmo buses, adding an east-west route in addition to the existing north-south route running along Magnolia Avenue. The new "Grapefruit" line will run from the corner of Summerlin and Central, past the new Dr. Philips Center for the Performing Arts, to the Amway Center and Sunrail station, and the area for the new Orlando City soccer stadium. The line will run clockwise, returning to Thornton Park via the Orlando History Center and Public Library. About half of the route will consist of bus rapid transit leans, which means the buses will have their own dedicated lanes and can control their own traffic signals, similar to Magnolia Avenue. Buses begin running at 6:00 a.m. on weekdays and at 10:00 a.m. on weekends. The buses run until 10:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and until midnight on Friday and Saturday. The new line will run every 10 minutes during office hours and every 15 minutes in the evenings.

MEET YOUR PUBLIC OFFICIALS

City Commissioner Patty Sheehan



Commissioner Sheehan was first elected to represent District 4 in the Orlando City Commission in 2000. Terms are four vears, on a non-partisan ballot. Commissioner Sheehan is well known for her advocacy of pedestrian safety, safe neighborhoods, historic preservation and a thriving downtown. She is proudest of the restoration of the iconic Lake Eola Fountain, the addition of 1.3 acres to Lake Eola Park, the preservation of the Eola House and construction of sidewalks for children walking to and from school. She was the first openly-gay elected official in Central Florida, and passed non-discrimination protections and Domestic Partnership legislation for the LGBT community. She is an urban agriculture advocate, and championed community gardens and urban chickens. She also worked with the Trust for Public Land to acquire the Orlando Urban Trail (OUT). She is a huge supporter of small business and Orlando's MainStreet Districts. She also lobbied and passed a Florida State Law allowing for Doggie Dining on outdoor patios in downtown Orlando. She is also the founder and chairperson for Wheels for Kids. Patty says that, "Thornton Park has become one of the premier neighborhoods of downtown Orlando. The bustling business district, special events, and traditional historic homes on tree lined brick streets make this a truly special place. I am honored to work for you to make Thornton Park even better!"

VICTORY GARDEN

Spring is coming, and but you need to be careful to plant vegetables that can survive the heat and rain of our Florida summers. March and April are good times to plant beans, melons, mustard, cucumbers, okra, peanuts, tomatoes, turnips, collards, and sweet potatoes.

CRAFTSMAN CORNER

Bungalows - Many of the Craftsman homes built in Thornton Park in the 1920s are called "bungalows". Bungalows were originally seaside cottages in Britain, but later were adopted by the Arts & Crafts movement. According to OldHouseOnline.com, Bungalow aesthetics fulfilled the ideals of William Morris, leader of the Arts & Crafts movement in England, who asserted that homes should contain only things of utility and beauty. They also suited Morris's American counterpart, Gustav Stickley, who, in response to Victorianism, called for simple, artistic houses that reflected democratic middle-class values. Many consider the craftsman bungalow to be the singularly American home type, built all over the country in the early 1900s. Characteristics of a bungalow include an open, wide front porch, square tapered columns, gabled roofs, exposed beams showcasing craftsmanship, and are usually faced in natural materials such as native wood clapboards, shingles, stucco, or local brick.
