CITY OF ORLANDO RECYCLING

You've probably noticed the large teal colored dumpsters that the City of Orlando switched to last year (away from the small red and blue crates). You can now mix all recyclables into this one large bin! If you have not received your dumpster, they can be requested at SWCustomerSVC@CityofOrlando.net or 407-246-2314 or on the City website. Dumpsters are emptied every other Friday. You can mix together:

CANS

- Aluminum cans
- Tin, steel, bi-metal cans
- · Lids from jars
- Milk cartons
- Juice boxes

PAPER

- Newspaper
- Cardboard (flatten all boxes)
- Clean pizza box
- Cartonboard/Cardboard
- Junk Mail
- Paperboard (cereal boxes & other cartons)
- Magazines

GLASS

- Food containers
- Beverage containers
- Any color or clear glass

PLASTICS

- All containers shapes & sizes
- Plastic laundry detergent with a 1 or 2 symbol on bottom

IMPORTANT

- · Empty containers only
- Flatten or cut cardboard boxes
- · All recyclables must be placed in the cart
- Set out your cart at least 2 feet away from other carts or objects

DO NOT INCLUDE

- No plastic bags
- No Styrofoam
- No window glass or mirrors
- No ceramics
- No light bulbs
- · No food contaminated paper
- No hardcover books
- No photos
- · No hazardous materials including automotive fluids, garden chemicals, paint products, cleaners and fluorescent lamps.

A TASTE OF THORNTON OCTOBER 15


