CITY AND COUNTY ARE NOW USING

NEXTDOOR.COM



A new app has been growing in popularity in Orlando. Nextdoor.com includes Thornton Park in their list of Orlando neighborhoods, and offers residents an additional way to connect, post announcements, and keep up on what's going on in the neighborhood. Thornton Park already has their own Facebook page and website (see the links to the left), but Nextdoor.com is a new communication tool, especially for folks who may not be friends on Facebook. According to their website, it's the easiest way for you and your neighbors to talk online and make all of your lives better in the real world. And it's free. People are using Nextdoor to:

- Quickly get the word out about a break-in
- Organize a Neighborhood Watch Group
- Track down a trustworthy babysitter
- Find out who does the best paint job in town
- Ask for help keeping an eye out for a lost dog
- Find a new home for an outgrown bike
- Finally call that nice man down the street by his first name

In addition to information from neighbors, the City and County are now putting information on Netwdoor.com. The Orange County Neighborhood Preservation & Revitalization Division (NPRD) will be utilizing Nextdoor to share information about Orange County Government's neighborhood assistance programs, public events, and emergency notifications. The Orlando Fire Department will be utilizing Nextdoor to share information on fire safety, events and programs, and emergency notifications. The City of Orlando is partnering with Nextdoor to help keep our residents informed, connected and involved. Mayor Dyer's Neighborhood Relations team will use Nextdoor to share important news and updates on City resources, programs, events and emergency notifications. Messages from the City can be easily accessed from the "City Agencies" tab on the left hand navigation bar of your Nextdoor account page. You will have the chance to share information and engage in the conversation.

Although you will regularly receive updates from the City and County, it's important to note that they cannot access or view any information that you and your neighbors have shared on Nextdoor, including your profile information.

John Mina
Orlando Police Chief



In February 2014, Mayor Dyer appointed John Mina, a 23-year OPD veteran to succeed Orlando Police Chief Paul Rooney after nearly 28 years of service to the citizens of Orlando. Mina will serve as the 38th Police Chief, and will oversee the day-to-day operations of the department and serve as chief counsel to the Mayor in matters of public safety. During his 23-year tenure with the Orlando Police Department, Mina has worked in a variety of divisions, including the West Patrol Division, the Criminal Investigations Division, the Community Policing Division, the Training Unit and the Drug Enforcement Division. He has also served as the Division Commander for both the North Patrol Division and the Criminal Investigations Division and served as Staff Director for the Chief of Police under former Chief Val Demings.

Chief Mina also served as a member of the SWAT Team for 17 years and was the Team Commander. Most recently, he served as the Bureau Commander for the Patrol Services Bureau, the largest section of OPD comprised of 392 sworn and civilian personnel.

Chief Mina is a graduate of the FBI National Academy and has also completed the Southern Police Institute Command Officer's Development Course. Chief Mina is currently working on a Master of Science in Criminal Justice from Columbia College.

HISTORICAL HAPPENINGS

Church Street

Church Street is generally assumed to have been named for the Union Church, located on the street from 1872 until 1891. A 1939 newspaper article claims that it was instead named after Colonel H.B.
