Her caretaker, Ivan Martinez, says she is doing pretty well, but will not be able to return to her two-story house in Thornton Park.



The Garden & Beautification Committee in Thornton Park picked its latest "Yard of the Season" on March 16. Mike and Erica Egeli at 210 North Brown Avenue received the Spring award for 2020, a full year after the Thornton Park Neighborhood Association started bestowing the prize upon worthy yards.

This particular property has seen quite a transformation in the last few years, and displays a cheery combination of colorful flowers, trimmed topiaries and hedges, along with small patches of green grass. Pollinator-friendly pentas and milkweed can be found at the base of the front steps, and potted plants bring the yard right up onto the porch.

The pinnacle of the yard, though, is the towering column of confederate jasmine, which is just beginning to bloom and will fill the street with their scent.
