True plant lovers live here! The Spring 2021 Yard of the Season goes to 200 N. Brown Ave, home to Joe and Ed. This property, locally famous for its beautiful passion fruit vine that rambles along the white fence, is home to an academic collection of bromeliads, cycads and palms.

In fact, they may have more plant species than any other yard in Thornton Park! Native saw palmettos and foreign cycads provide a bit of a barrier between the brisk bustle at that awkward intersection of Brown Avenue and Jefferson Street, where cars are supposed to continue in one direction curve up Florida Highway 15. Look closely and you may spy the little fountain hidden in the bushes, a rabbit hiding under an avocado tree, or tiny climbing bromeliads on the side of the garage. Spring is here!
