The evening is the annual fundraiser for the Thornton Park Neighborhood Association, and will again be sponsored by the Thornton Park District along with the Downtown Development Board. Proceeds allow the TPNA to pay for projects including fountain upkeep, quarterly newsletters, holiday luminaries, Easter egg hunt, socials

For \$40, guests can sample unlimited tastes and drinks from neighborhood businesses who donate their products and time for the event. A DJ will provide music and entertainment.

The restaurant attached to Burton's Bar will serve classic bar and comfort food with rotating specials.

Benjamin's French Bakery has new owner

You may have noticed a small remodel of Benjamin's. That's because it's under new ownership. John Penington purchased the bakery and café in October 2021 from the French family from Bordeaux, who after nine years, were ready to do some traveling. The menu has remained largely the same with the addition of a few more pastries such as Danishes and cinnamon rolls. Penington said he would eventually like to add charcuterie boards and light appetizers for wine after work happy hours, and to stay open longer on weekends once he gets more staff.

SUMMER 2022 YARD OF THE SEASON

The TPNA Gardening & Beautification Committee has selected their 2022 Summer Yard of the season at 819 E. Pine Street.

A cute white picket fence surrounds the corner lot and is reflected in the porch railings, too. A very large Hawaiian ti plant greets visitors next to the porch stairs, and cheerful blue evolvulus, or dwarf morning glories, line the sidewalks.

A bed of small purple Mexican Heather fills in the corner of the yard shaded by a Japanese blueberry tree. Bees buzz around the bottlebrush bush on the corner of the newly extended porch, and colorful annual-filled pots extend the garden up onto the porch.

Winter-blooming white azaleas form a hedge below the porch, with several layers and textures of plants below them. Hibiscus punctuates the side yard with disks of red, offering pretty views from both Pine Street and Hyer Avenue.





I was walking down Thornton Avenue the other day, when a car came racing down the hill and scared the living daylights out of me!


My, how fast some drivers drive on our streets! I would hope that all of our neighbors drive slowly and courteously when


