

A new boutique has opened at 908 East Washington Street. Art Infinitum hand crafts made-to-order men's and women's clothing, which avoids waste according to their website. They share the office space with QB Elite Model Talent agency.

Owners Sebastien and Dedra Syssau said they chose Thornton Park "for its peaceful atmosphere and beautiful streets, yet, good foot traffic, Lake Eola and its Festivals and Market days. East Washington is always alive at anytime of the day."

The designs often use Sebastien Syssau's art transferred to premium fabrics such as leather, silk and velvet. They also create their own colors such as "Blue Infinitum". Delivery takes seven to ten days on average.

Other items include paintings, purses, backpacks, ties, towels, cushions, scarves, jewelry, hats and shoes.





SPRING 2023 YARD OF THE SEASON



An inviting brick path winds its way from the front porch and a live oak provides shade from the southeast corner.
