Jomigo's Deli & Good Eatzz at the Veranda

A new deli has opened at the Veranda at 707 E. Washington Street. In addition to traditional deli sandwiches such as pastrami, rubens, and egg salad, Jomigo's also offers a duck and brie sandwich, a Cuban, grilled cheese and a Greek salad. Jomigo's has also partnered with popular Karelyn's Vegan to offer vegan deli options such as "turkey, beef, steak, pork BBQ and cheese."

Rochelle's Bean and Boba Bar at the Veranda

Also at the Veranda at 707 E. Washington Street, Rochelle's Bean and Boba Bar offers various coffees, espressos and cappuccinos. They also have boba and Thai teas, with vegan tapioca options.

Power Move Fabrics (PMF) moves from 818 to 888 E. Washington

Local clothier PMF, operating online since 2009, has moved a few doors down into Jay Johnson's old salon. The space will allow owner Chris Privilege, who runs The Shave Shop next door, to better display his line of unisex everyday clothes and athletic wear that he hopes to gear towards Thornton Park neighbors.

FALL 2023 YARD OF THE SEASON



The Thornton Park Gardening & Beautification Committee has chosen 16 N. Thornton Ave. as our Yard of the Season. This property achieves a seamless flow from the yard up on to the porch, with a nice variety of potted plants. Bougainvillea provide seasonal shots of color, while two hedges of different levels and textures create interest. Potted, colorful coleus are easy to propagate, and moss roses, pentas, tiny yellow mecardonia and silver-white artemisia provide pops of color and texture. Crotons, Hawaiian Ti and tropical pandanus round out the wide variety of plants in this nicely kept yard along busy Thornton Avenue.

THE CHANGING FACE OF CHURCH STREET

If you've walked down the 700-800 block of Church Street, you've probably noticed some new houses. This section of Thornton Park is not in the Lake Lawsona Historic District, and therefore properties can be redeveloped.

In 1994 when the Historic District was created, the houses were considered too new to qualify for protection. Most of the houses were built in the 1950s and 1960s and are good examples of Mid-Century Modern architecture. The two new houses on the south side of the street are a "neo-Modern" style, and compliment the others on the street pretty well.

VILASA TOWNHOMES MOVING FORWARD

The lot with the run-down office building that was torn down last year at 1000 E. Robinson Street is now the site of a townhome project that is underway. Originally designed by developer Mark Kinchla as the "T-Park 11", the property was later purchased by Verax Investments, a group of three doctors, who also bought the Veranda and the Thornton Park Central building.

According to their website, there will be "11 luxurious townhomes offering spacious living, ranging from 2,300 to 2,500 square feet each, and one duplex featuring two 2,000-square-foot units." It is planned to be finished by summer 2024.



The two-story duplex will border the one-story houses to the south along E. Jefferson Street, which are in the Lake Lawsona Historic District. This creates a step-down height transition from the three-story townhomes. There will also be new public parking spaces on Hyer Avenue. They are keeping as many of the old trees around the perimeter as they can, and will also plant new ones. They will also be burying the powerlines along both Hyer Avenue and Robinson Street.
