OLYMPIC MARATHON TO GO THROUGH THORNTON

PARK FEB 3

While Thornton Park is used to hosting footraces, parades and other large events, one historic marathon will come through our neighborhood on Saturday, February 3. The U.S. Olympic Team Trials for Marathon will determine the top three men and top three women who will



represent Team USA at the 2024 Paris Summer Olympic Games.

Starting at 10:00 a.m., the race should last about 2.5 hours. Women will start ten minutes behind the men. A marathon is 26.2 miles long, so runners will make three loops around the course.

The City is encouraging spectators to line the streets to cheer on the runners. Roadways, including South Street, will be fully closed from 5:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., but unlike the Corporate 5K and other races, most of Thornton Park will not be boxed in. Residents on South Street, Daniels Avenue and S. Hyer Avenue need to be aware that they will be boxed in. Pedestrian crossings of South Street will be at Summerlin and Mills.

The Veranda will also be hosting major sponsor Brooks Running shoes with a retail area and a meet-and-greet with some of the Olympic athletes.

items, women's clothing, handmade home décor, candles and other gift items. The store is owned by Nicole Escobar who began the store as a pop-up in 2020.



WINTER 2023 YARD OF THE SEASON



The Thornton Park Gardening & Beautification Committee chose 1007 E. Washington St as its Winter 2023 Yard of the Season. Winter is appropriate considering this yard succeeds in growing plants that normally enjoy colder weather including blooming hostas and two types of roses. The coleus are doing really well in this shaded garden, along with aloe and foxtail ferns. A pygmy date palm frames the grassless yard on one side, while a small retaining wall helps keep the elevated garden in place. Colorful crotons, bright fusia Hawaii Tis, butterfly-friendly pentas, and a star jasmine round out this yard.
