## **General & Narrative Film Grants**

- Screen Craft Film Grant: Offers two production grants per year for narrative features, short films, TV pilots, and documentaries that show originality and potential.
- SFFILM Rainin Grant: The largest granting body for independent narrative feature films in the U.S., supporting films that address social justice issues in a positive and meaningful way.
- The Film Fund: Provides an alternative to traditional funding by offering grants for short films, often requiring a simple application process focusing on the script/concept.
- Filmmakers Without Borders (FWB): Supports independent filmmakers globally
  with grants for narrative films, documentaries, and new media projects aligning
  with themes of social justice, empowerment, and cultural exchange.
- Austin Film Society (AFS) Grant: Awards funds annually to Texas-based filmmakers working in any style or genre.
- Roy W. Dean Grant: Funds independent films (documentaries, narrative features, shorts, web series, etc.) that are unique and make a positive contribution to society.
- National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH): Provides grants for media projects (film and radio) that use humanities scholarship to engage a broad public audience.
- Sloan Distribution Grant: A \$50,000 grant awarded by Film Independent to a film entering the distribution phase that depicts themes grounded in real science, technology, or economics.
- Women in Film Finishing Fund: Offers finishing funds and in-kind services to complete films by, for, or about women.

## **Documentary Film Grants**

- Catapult Film Fund: Provides development funding to documentary filmmakers who have a compelling story, secured access to it, and are ready to shoot for production fundraising purposes.
- SFFILM Documentary Film Fund (DFF): Supports feature-length documentaries in post-production with compelling stories and an innovative visual approach, open to international filmmakers.
- IDA Enterprise Documentary Fund: The International Documentary Association (IDA) provides grants to documentary projects, including the Pare Lorentz Documentary Fund.
- Sundance Documentary Fund: Offers grants for U.S. and international contemporary independent documentary films, supporting various stages of production.
- Miller/Packan Documentary Film Fund: Supports documentaries that educate, inspire, and enrich, with open calls every season for grants up to \$25K.
- AXS Film Fund: Specifically supports documentary filmmakers and non-fiction new media creators of color with disabilities.
- AlterCiné Documentary Grants: Primarily focused on supporting feature films in early development by young filmmakers from the Global South (Africa, Asia, and Latin America) making work on the theme of rights and freedoms.

## **Key Resources for Finding Grants**

- **Film Independent:** Offers various labs, grants (e.g., the SHIFT Creative Fund), and fiscal sponsorship programs with rolling application cycles.
- No Film School: Publishes regular, updated lists of grants, labs, and fellowships with upcoming deadlines.
- Women Make Movies: Offers a list of funders and resources for women filmmakers.

Where to look for affordable grant writers

- Freelance platforms: Websites like Upwork and Thumbtack have a wide range of grant writers with different experience levels and pricing structures.
- **Job boards:** Websites like Indeed and <u>ZipRecruiter</u> often list positions for grant writers, which may include roles for organizations focused on affordable housing.
- **Grant writing services:** Some companies offer project-based or subscription-based models that can be more budget-friendly, such as Just Write Grants and CEDA.
