About the Neighborhood

Gravois Park is a historic^[2] neighborhood in St. Louis. The namesake park dates from 1812 (a grant made by the US government^[3]), and was praised for its beauty in the nineteenth century already,^[4] and in 1914 was part of a walking tour of the city meant to show off the City Plan Commission's "idealized view of the shape of the city."^[5]

About the Association

Gravois Park Neighborhood Association is a nonprofit organization that meets in The Rita Ford Community Center. GPNA was started in 1999 with original President Rita Ford and continues with resident volunteers.

Monthly meetings occur from January to November on the second Tuesday of each month starting at 6pm.

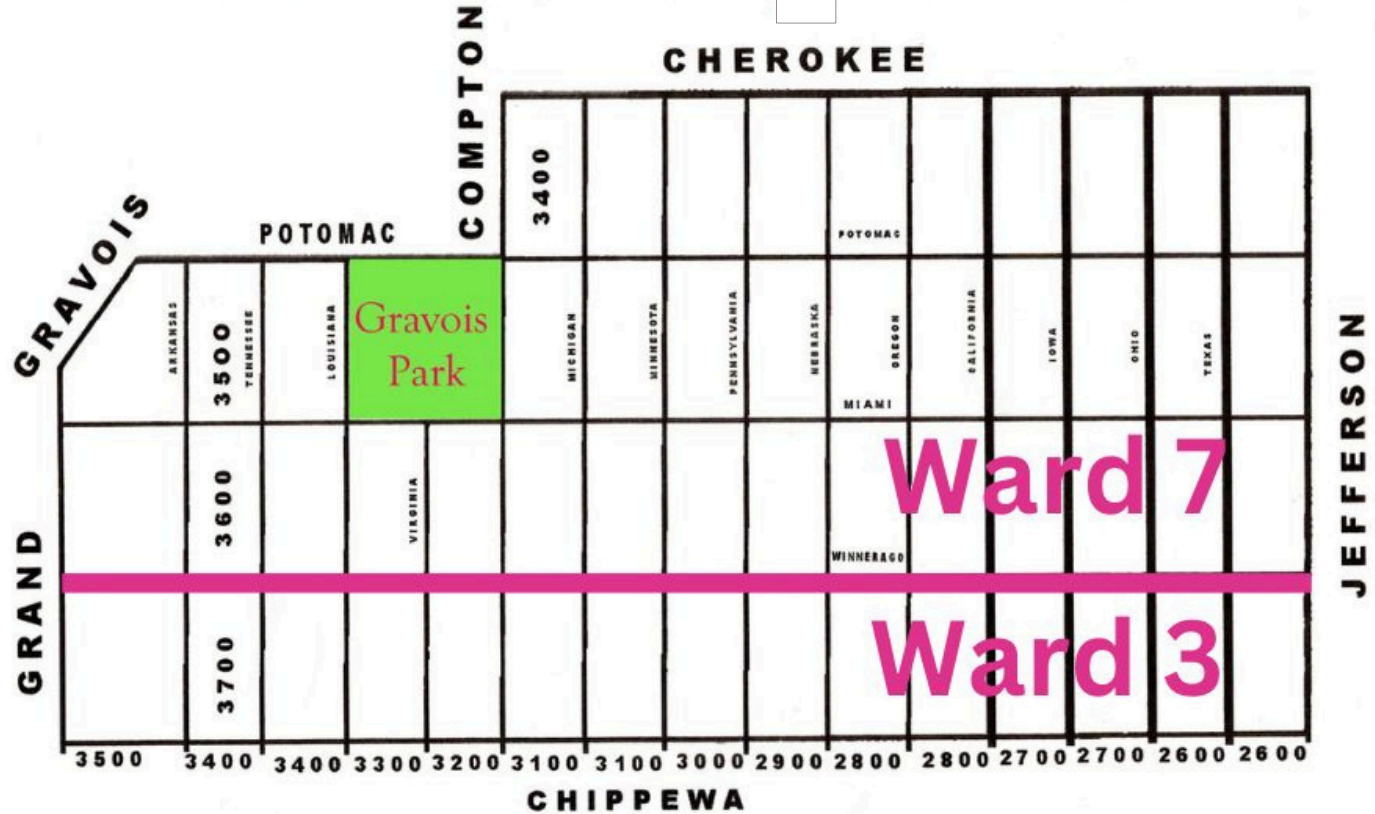

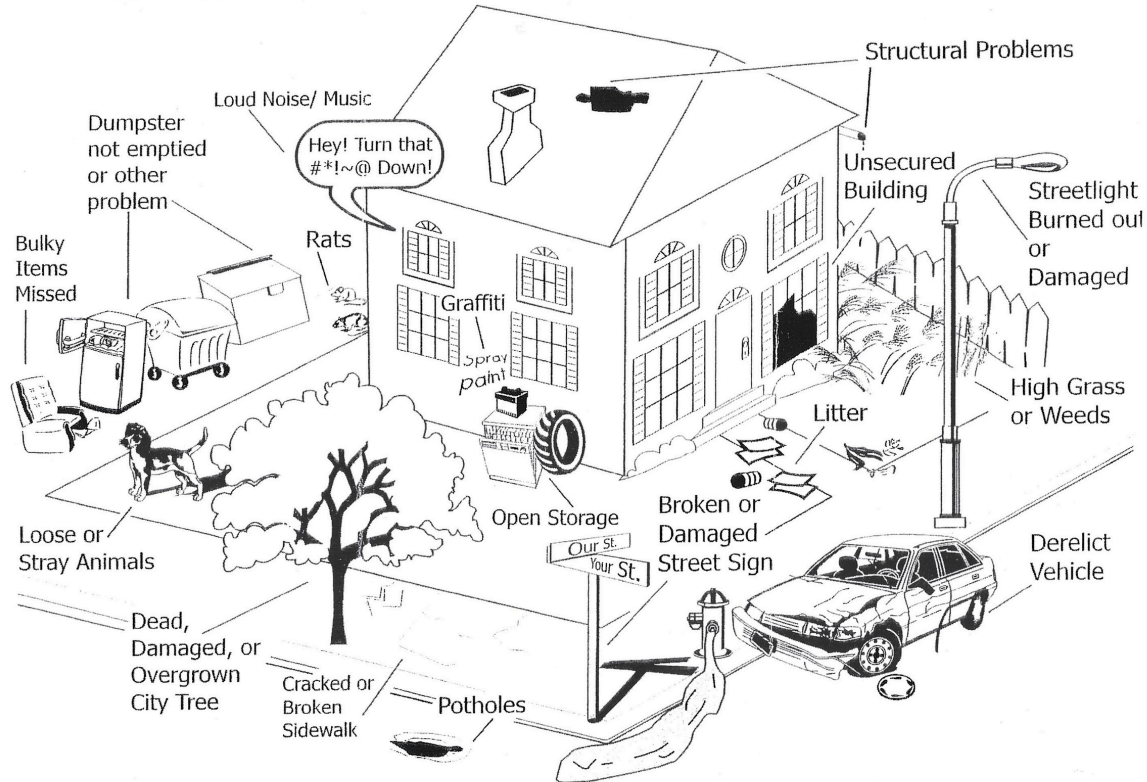

Our neighborhood's park, Gravois Park, between Miami, Compton, Potomac and Louisiana, is beautiful and historic, it was established in 1812. Several residents pass through the park every day!

The park is open to everyone but please keep in mind a few guidelines:

- Trash goes in trash cans. Please put your own trash in the barrels, and please pick up trash left behind by others.
Our neighborhood has a major litter problem. Be a good example- let other people see you picking up trash.
- No unleashed dogs, drinking or drugs.
- Park curfew is 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. No one is allowed in the park between these times.
- No vehicles in the park.
- Graffiti, broken playground equipment, burned-out lights, dead tree limbs, etc. are all handled through the Citizen's Service Bureau, (314) 622-4800 or tweet at Citizens' Svc Bureau @stlcsb
- Questions about events and upkeep can be directed to the Parks Dept (314) 289-5300.

Trash Tips

Litter

Please be a good example for our children. Put trash in trash cans. Let other people see you picking up trash. Trashy streets and alleys are embarrassing for all of us. Besides, there are \$500-\$1000 fines and jail time for litterbugs. Property owners and residents are responsible for the condition of the street and alley.

Dumpsters

- Trash needs to go inside of—not on top of or around—the dumpsters.
- If your children take out the trash, make sure they are tall enough to open the lid.
- The lid has to be closed. No trash on or around the dumpster.
- Big items have to fit inside and can't stick out.
- If the dumpster's overflowing or the trash truck can't get to it because it's blocked by trash, then they just plain don't pick it up.
- Building material (plaster, drywall, tile, carpet, etc.) is not allowed.

Roll Out Carts

- On trash day (see what day it says on your cart), the cart needs to be rolled out to the alley or street for pick-up by 5:30 a.m., so please do it the night before. Put the handle toward the alley or street so the truck can empty the cart.
- Afterward, roll the cart back into your yard by 11 p.m. This keeps other people from misusing or even stealing your cart.
- All the other dumpster rules apply to carts

Illegal Dumping

- The City is getting really tough on illegal dumping.
- If you see someone dumping trash in violation of the rules, get a full description of the persons/vehicles (including license plate number whenever possible), and call 911.
- People in our neighborhood have received \$100 rewards for reporting trash violations.
- You may also report dumping to Citizens Service Bureau at 314-622-4800 or the Police Trash Task Force at 314-622-4800.

Bulk Trash

Mattresses, refrigerators, etc

- In Gravois Park, bulky items are picked up sometime during the week of the second Monday of the month. The schedule is on a sticker on your dumpster.
- Each house can put out up to three items, but you need to put the items out by Monday morning at 5:30. They have all week to pick up, however.
- Don't block the dumpster, carts or alley with the big trash.
- Take the doors off the refrigerator or freezer. Also, City residents can take trash to the dump just east of I-55 at Gasconade Street, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

NEW TAX BENEFITS FOR YOUR 2026 DONATIONS

Good news for our community! Starting in 2026, you can reduce your taxable income by donating to local non-profits, even if you do not itemize your deductions.

The “Above-the-Line” Deduction is Back

For the 2026 tax year, individuals taking the standard federal tax deduction can claim a limited deduction for cash donations made to qualified 501(c)(3) public charities. This reduces your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) directly.

Deduction Limits for Non-Itemizers

\$1,000 — Single Filers

\$2,000 — Married Filing Jointly

Key Details for Taxpayers

- **Eligible Contributions:** Cash donations including checks, credit cards, and online payments made directly to public charities.
- **Ineligible Contributions:** Donations to donor-advised funds (DAFs), private foundations, or supporting organizations.
- **No Carry-Forward:** Contributions exceeding the annual limit cannot be carried forward.

- **Documentation:** Written acknowledgment required for any single donation of \$250 or more. Support Your Neighborhood Today Your contributions help us continue our mission in the community.
