For Schools and Education:

Mandatory mental health screenings at school entry and specific grades, including online and homeschooled students, with provided resources for parents.

Comprehensive psychological evaluations, funded by schools, for students expelled due to threats or violent acts.

Alternative to suspension involving restorative education, mental health assessment, and counseling.

School districts must contract with Certified Parent/Family Support Specialists to support parents in mental health service decisions.

Recognition of parents and outside therapists as experts, with school support for technology restrictions or remote learning based on safety concerns.

Mandatory Complex Trauma and Attachment Disorder training for school personnel, with additional hours for special education staff.
