We had the great pleasure of hosting **Nathan Coe Marsh** on the 9th of September. Nathan has made his living performing magic for corporate audiences for the past 20 years, he has appeared

on Penn and Teller Fool Us, and has some very interesting and unique takes on the classics of magic. The lecture opened with a 30-minute show with some extremely commercial magic, all of which have been in Nathan's professional repertoire. He opened with very quick and eye pleasing vanish of a handkerchief that was in a wine glass before magically producing a shot glass filled with liquid from seemingly empty hands. After grabbing the audience's attention, he performed a unique take on the Ultra Mental Deck (Invisible deck) plot with a completely normal deck of cards. His take on this ended with him magically plucking a card out of a shuffled deck that had been tossed into the air. The card that was randomly chosen ended up to have a twin card from another deck that was inside a balloon that had been in the audience's possession since before the card was even selected. Then he dazzled the audience with a very funny thumb tie routine based off the Jay Marshall's handling and ended his first set with a brilliant bill to orange routine, in which he never touches the orange (as it was in a plastic bag the entire time).



After the performance he went into extreme detail on all of his effects. He not only explained the workings of

everything, but the reasoning behind every move he made. He even gave alternative handlings to make things a bit more angle proof. He talked about his time on Penn and Teller and how he came up with the routine that he performed. He closed with two close up routines, a coins across and a close up/parlor effect with cards where he read everyone's minds who chose a card. Overall a very enjoyable lecture!

Ring 129 in KC

Earlier this month Ring 129 in Kansas City hosted 'A Day of Magic and Annual Magic Auction'. This was an all-day event, starting at 10am and ending around 10pm. It was practically a mini magic convention. **David Sandy** acted as host for the day keeping things moving and making announcements throughout. Those in attendance enjoyed a mini magic lectures from Kansas City local and professional magician **Todd Lamanske** where he taught 3 commercial routines that were very visual and instantly reset, perfect for any table-hopping magician. Following Todd's lecture was a full-length lecture by **Larry Brodahl** who entertained and taught us several routines that were perfect for "AV" (any venue).

Not only where the routines very entertaining through the original patter and hilarious scripting, but they were extremely easy for anyone to do. Larry had obviously put in a lot of work and thought into the routines and even though he left shortly after his lecture, he was the talk of the mini convention for the rest of the day. Lunch was



brought in and time for magicians to mingle and chat was given. There was a magical game that was played that David Sandy came up with (with his permission, we will be playing this at our Christmas party this year), and hundreds of dollars in door prizes were given out to random attendees, compliments of US Toys in KC. After lunch it was time for the auction where magicians sold their magic props, tricks, gimmicks, and DVDs with a small percentage going back to the club. There were some AMAZING deals that came up in this auction! A box of 100 DVDs went for \$100, most of which were bought for \$30 apiece. Some larger props that were extremely well made went for half of their original sale price. I even walked away with a few things that I am excited to routine and perform! All of the magicians went out to dinner (most of us teamed up and went to Applebee's) where we got to jam out and talk magic over dinner. After dinner, we came back to the church where everything was taking place to sit it on another great lecture from Chad Long. If you don't know Chad Long's work, you should. He is a phenomenal technician with some truly astounding thinking. His passion for magic was obvious and his thinking was truly inspiring. My favorite routine that he shared was when he broke a piece of uncooked spaghetti into several tiny pieces, popped it into his mouth, and shortly after crunching through all of the pieces he pulled out a full length, unbroken strand of uncooked spaghetti! If they do this event again, I would highly encourage you to make the trip down. I know I will be going back if time allows!

September Meeting

I have had something in the works for several months now that I have not announced to many people. Back in March I was approached by the Johnny Carson School for Theater and Film to come in and teach a master class to the UNL students that are part of the performing arts college. I have been working with about 30 students teaching them a simple magic routine that they will learn to perfect (to the best of their abilities) over the next several months. Soon her pockets always had some matchsticks or toothpicks to show her friends a new puzzle she'd learned. Magical things and the thinking that goes along with them had begun to find a place in her passions fueled by her curiosities. The fact that she also grew up close to Appleton, Wisconsin (birthplace to Harry Houdini) only furthered her interest.

Then came a thirty-year career in the food industry as a safety and quality compliance director with such companies as Nabisco, ConAgra, and Quaker. Living in Chicago during part of that time she had a chance to see Penn and Teller and David Copperfield perform live in the early stages of their careers.
