Scott Klinger's Online Meeting





Magic continued to be his main hobby even as he became a young married man who had a challenging career in the restaurant industry. After several years, those long, demanding working hours became a real grind. They were taking a toll on his family life, but, fortunately, Steve had a very supportive wife, Gina. She knew of his love for magic and persuaded him to take a chance and develop his goal of a full-time career as a magician.

Not knowing what persona he should develop or how to get gigs, Steve sought out guidance. He joined the Society of American Magicians, to which our Omaha Magical Society belongs, in order to gain insight into the process of building his career. That was about twenty years ago, when **Jeff Quinn** was the president.

Immediately, Steve experienced encouragement from Jeff and other members of the club. He met **Jered Schaurgaard, w**ho became one of Steve's


mentors. Gerard helped him gain work doing close-up magic in restaurants. That is when Steve became **The Amazing Lindy!**



As Steve expanded his skills, he gained more gigs through another Omaha magician and friend, **Arthur Fratelli**. Through support from Arthur and other fellow magicians, Steve could finally develop what was once his part-time

hobby into full-time work as a magician. He honed his close-up tricks and created more elaborate stage shows, and word-of-mouth spread.



Today, <u>The Amazing Lindy</u> entertains at festivals, corporate venues, retirement facilities, restaurants, private parties and clubs. He has been employed at the Texas Roadhouse in Council Bluffs for 13 years performing magic tricks sprinkled with his comedy for the lucky diners.

In addition, Steve is paying it forward by training young magicians enrolled in the OMS Junior Magicians program. I am sure while working with these enthusiastic young students and watching them practice and perform it is like deja vu for Steve as he remembers entertaining his neighbors at the same ages as these potential future magicians.


