

Tom was recognized as a **Lifetime Member of S.A.M.** and was awarded with both the **Excalibur and Excelsior distinctions** from The International Brotherhood of Magicians, for his sixty years of support.

### June Re-Cap by Matt Spielman

**Doc Eason**, the Rocky Mountain Magician, was our guest lecturer for the June OMS meeting. Doc is

a legend in the magic community and is considered the best bar magician in the world. For 27 years he was the feature performer at John Denver's Tower Magic Bar in Snowmass Village and has traveled the world giving lectures on bar magic. His main philosophy that he mentioned multiple times to the group was "it's not about the trick, it's about the connection".





Doc wasted no time engaging our group with one of his favorite openers "All Screwed Up", a two in the hand one in the pocket routine with nuts and bolts. He pointed out the importance of getting the audience's attention quickly and connecting with them on a personal level. Doc's ability to weave jokes and misdirection in his storytelling was incredible to see in person, he showcased this with his card under glass routine. He boldly told the group that he was going to place a card without us catching him and after a few jokes and misdirection he was able to sneak a card under the glass without getting caught.

Another staple of Doc

's repertoire is the ability to engage and disarm his audience simply by addressing them by name. He quoted Maya Angelou, "I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel", and proceeded to go around the group asking for names. Once a small group was selected every individual made a card selection that was returned to the deck. With the greatest of ease Doc addressed everyone by their name and was able to produce their card each in a unique way closing his set. Doc Eason was an amazing guest and the information from his lecture is something we can all incorporate into our performances and daily lives. My interaction with him is something I will never forget.



# Larry's Logic

### How do I fit a trick into my show? WRAP UP

For me, the WRAP UP is the most important part of the act. It's where I remind the audience that:

- they've been great
- we've all had fun
- I thank various volunteers by name and by trick (Sarah helped with the Rings, etc.)
- my name
- I thank them all.

Remember Maya Angelou's advice:

"I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but **people will never** forget how you made them feel."

So, I *remind* them that we've all had fun. And even if we didn't (which happens), I'm going to pretend we did so that they think I liked them. (Which I usually don't if the show doesn't go well.)

I *remind* them that members of the audience helped, and did a great job. I mean, who doesn't like being complimented? And it hammers home that their friends/family/acquaintances got to see the magic up close – and were still fooled!

And I remind them of WHO I AM!

Now I actually consider the last TWO tricks in my show to be in the WRAP UP.

Trick #1 is where I usually put a very strong/very funny piece of magic with a volunteer. I have about 3 tricks that I rotate into this position, depending on my mood and the audience Trick #2 is the FINALE. This is a duplicate of my opener in INTENT.

Magic must occur quickly. Not within 10 seconds, but not much past that either. Again, the routine can be long, it just has to have something happen quickly.

It must be obvious. It must fool the audience. Be funny. And it MUST be just me and small non-magical looking props.

My FINALE has been the same trick for the last 35+ years. For my "B" and "Q" shows though (See previous articles), I have tried other tricks. And 2 of them got strong enough reactions to be FINALES for my "A" act.

Which is what I wanted.

I have quite a bit of material for the MIDDLE of the act. But the opener and closers are so important to me that replacing them is nigh impossible. So, I'm always on a chase for new material that will fit the bill. And I'm crazy enough to think that as I get better, smarter, more experienced, I'll find more.



Yet another in our series of scripts for magic tricks that can be performed over the phone.

#### **Magic Poker**

"Please take a pack of playing cards and begin to

shuffle them thoroughly so that neither you nor I know where any card in the deck might be. I will attempt to read your mind as you play a game of psychic poker. Let me explain the rules.

First, I ask that you deal face down two piles of cards on the table. Each pile must have five cards. Let me repeat. Please deal two piles of cards face down on the table with each pile having five cards in it.

Please place these two piles side by side.

Now turn over and look at the top card of the right-hand pile. Stare at it so that you won't forget it. If anyone else is in the room, show it to them too. Then place it back face down on top of the pile from which you removed it.

Then pick up the left-hand pile of cards and I'm going to give you a choice. You can discard one, two, three, or even four cards from that pile. Just remove one, two, three or four cards from that pile and put them way over to the side out of the way. Place what remains in your hand face down onto the right-hand pile.



You have now buried your card. And you'll have to admit that it would be nearly impossible for me to know exactly how deep in the pile your card now resides.

Well, we're about to mix the cards even further. Please listen carefully to my instructions.

I want you to pick up the pile that contains your card and turn it face up in your hand. Deal what is now the face up top card onto the table. Have you done that?

Good.

The next face up card I want you to take and place it onto the bottom of the stack in your hand.

Then deal the next card onto the other face up card on the table with the next card going under the hand-held stack. The next card goes onto the growing table pile with the next card going under the hand stack. Continue this alternating process until you have all the cards from your hand pile face up in a stack on the table.

You have now mixed the cards.

Please pick up the pile from the table and turn it face down in your hand.

Now I want you to try and send me a picture of the card you first looked at in the beginning of this trick. Do this by taking the first card on top of the facedown pile and looking at it. If it's your selected card, think "yes." If it is not your card, think "no." I'm definitely getting a "no."

Please put that card aside.

Now turn over the next card and hold it up in your hand. Again, think the word "yes" if it is your card or "no" if it is not. Please put that card aside, it is not your card.

Try it again with the next card. Please think "yes" if it is your card and "no" if it is not. Wait a minute! I'm definitely getting a different signal this time! That is your card! Am I right? I thought so."
