Discover Magic Families Discover the Abbott House



The Christmas tree sparkled invitingly next to the cozy fire awaiting the arrival of the Discover Magic students and their parents. **Steve Lindeman** and **Patrice Fisher** had extended an invitation to tour the Abbott House as a holiday "thank you" to all. Now it was just a matter of seeing who would arrive at the designated time on a beautiful, albeit brisk Sunday afternoon in November. Soon, nine guests, kiddos with their folks, arrived!

We began outside, walking around the side, passing the hitching-post for horses that still stands strong after a century of Omaha weather. Just imagine the tales it could tell of guests and magicians arriving, for a show perhaps? Walking around to the front of the house, we took a moment to admire the roomy front porch with its unique "icicle" shaped light. We opened the front door to an entryway or front vestibule that could be used for whatever purpose, but now has our guest book perched near the French doors that open into the parlor. The parlor is where most of the magic happened, in front of a still beautifully tiled fireplace.

For those of you who are reading about the Abbott House for the first time, we recently acquired the property, with the goal of creating an homage to Abbott and the incredible illusions that he invented and performed only in the confines of his comfortable, Craftsman.

As our guests stepped inside, as if frozen in time, we highlighted the many original details that have been kept in pristine condition in this century old home. In the dimly lit parlor the amazing inventor and magician, **David P. Abbott**, and his "confederate" assistant and wife, **Fannie**, would perform for their guests. Abbott built this beautiful brick home in 1913-14, and it became his main stage when hosting magicians visiting Omaha after they performed at the Orpheum Theater. The home was tricked it out with his illusions like the Talking Tea Kettle, Floating Ball, and Spirit Pictures (spiritualism being a huge curiosity and interest of that period).

During our walk-about, one of our young magicians named **Noah Kroeger** was very interested in the details of how the home was set up to hide the secrets of



Abbott's illusions. As a student of the magical arts, Noah is fascinated with the science and engineering of a magic effect. Was his wonderment first cultivated during the annual Christmas shows performed as part of the festivities at Noah's home by their family friend, **Walter Graham**? Yes, Noah, as a wee lad of single digits, was privy to the magic of our life-long member and major character in the story of the Abbott house and the Omaha Magical Society.

For a magical finale, The Amazing Lindy showed everyone an "old" light bulb found in the bowels of the house. He gingerly handed the bulb to one of our students, Drew, and told him to be careful with that delicate artifact and to hold it "away from your body." Actually, holding it out was a better visual for what was to come...Lindy instructed Drew to pull the invisible cord from the bottom of the bulb and ZAP the bulb turned on and glowed brightly, until, with another pull, it obediently turned off. Our guests were delighted to have magic as an appropriate end to their tour.

After our tour concluded, while unplugging the tree, it occurred to me that we had come full circle. Yes, we were back in the parlor, but that is not the full circle that I mean. If it were not for his curiosity about David Abbott, Walter Graham would not have discovered a lost Abbott manuscript that he proceeded to complete and publish to honor the man that he so admired. The book that was self-published in 1977 was entitled **David P.**Abbott's Book of Mysteries and promoted by Graham in the Society of American Magicians magazine.

That was only half of our full circle. The rest of the circle was completed by our benefactor for the house, Teller, from the Penn and Teller master magician team. Years earlier, as a young student of magic, Teller read Walter's book (whom Graham attributed to Abbott as the original author) and wrote him a fan letter. That book sparked Teller's interest and his research about David Abbott, and in the years to follow, a steadfast friendship grew between Teller and our O.M.S. member Walter Graham. So, the circle was made complete with our student tour. The relationship between our beloved member Walter Graham and Teller had led to Teller's acquisition and donation of the Abbott House to our Society. Now, it is our club's mission to recreate the atmosphere of the "House of Mystery" and make it a destination for magic in the Midwest, dedicated to the legacy of Omaha's own David P. Abbott.

The Omaha Magical Society has published a book about the man and his house, written by a local investigator with the pseudonym Miss Cassette. The book is entitled Mysteries of Omaha: The House on 3316 Center Street. It is a well-researched account about the house, known as The David P. Abbott House of Mystery and the man who built it. It is available through our Omaha Magical Society for a donation of \$135, or more, of course, if you desire.






