
And remember: you don't have to be a seasoned pro. Whether you're trying close-up magic for the first time or have done it for decades, you're welcome to jump in and be part of the fun.



**Mike Ware** and his wife have filled our twelfth Abbott House member slot. Welcome. Mike has also agreed to be a new member of the Abbott house board.





On Saturday, July 19th, magicians gathered at the Abbott House to focus on what many refer to as the oldest trick in the book, "The Cups & Balls." The class started out with introductions followed by a demonstration by locally renowned cups & balls artist, **Ryan Chandler**.



Though Ryan taught one of his original routines, it appeared as though a spell had been cast within the house, for everyone in the room was able

to perform the routine smoothly... except Ryan. Fellow "Fool Us "alumni, **Theron Milo Christensen** then took over the reins by displaying his two-cup & ball routine which showcased how to direct an audience's attention exactly where it needs to be at the right moment. Theron then led a discussion on thoughts and approaches to building and presenting an original routine. After the discussion, Ryan was able to finally shake off the curse of the cups and perform his street routine featuring wand spin ball vanishes and multiple final loads.



To end the day, sorcerer historian, **Scott Klinger**, reached into his endless bag of mystery to bring out his cups and balls collection while providing context as well as a dash of history to each set. The

course was fun-filled and time seemed to disappear as if by magic. A huge thank you to **Louis Villamonte** for donating sets of cups and balls to those who attended.




**Steve Nespor** and **Joe Cole**


with our stage show at the **Boys Town Music Hall** from 1:00 to 2:00 pm

Members in attendance were given a performance feedback form to help track down which principles were violated in each performance. At the end of the night the winner by popular vote would be awarded the "What's Missing" trophy, which may or may not be cursed.

First up for the night was myself, **Matt Spielman**, performing a confabulation routine in which a dollar in plain view throughout the performance is handed out after a series of questions and mysteriously has every answer written correctly on the back of the bill. Audience members correctly pointed out the unnecessary lengthy talk about work (vulnerability) along with other principles I didn't plan on breaking (mumbling, props too small). All in all it was good to get up and perform for the crowd and get immediate feedback to target areas to improve upon for future growth.



Mike Bitter was up next to perform Daryl's great rope routine "The Acrobatic Knot". Mike kicked off the performance by dropping his ropes (prop management) and knocking his head on the table in the process of recovering, somehow he managed to get back on his

feet to continue the show. As soon as he got back on track he took a loud phone call from his mother breaking up the pacing of his routine, despite all of the antics he was able to get the knot to jump rope to rope rounding out his performance.



The **What's Missing**Trophy

Neil Babel rounded out the night with his delightfully odd collection of tricks. Neil brought up Linda, an audience member, and produced several colored eggs while incorrectly calling out the colors during his long winding story about his color blindness (instructional clarity). During his card performance he gave wildly unclear instructions to the trick but with the right amount of crazy he kept it funny and entertaining with a whiteboard reveal of their chosen card.



At the end of the night **Mike Bitter's** performance was chosen by popular vote to have the best of the "worst". It takes a great amount of skill to keep a routine entertaining while purposefully bombing, Mike's personality and skill were on full display and was well deserving of the trophy. ## FOUR KINGS

Use a paper lunch sack instead of a hat, and you'll be able to show your audience how you warm up before you begin performing card tricks.



The magician shows four kings from a pack of playing cards. He puts them in a hat with the pack.





The hat is shaken and the cards are mixed; yet the magician reaches in and brings out the kings (maybe after two failed attempts?)!



The Secret: Affix a paper clip to the four kings. Hold your thumb over it. You can find those four kings any time you wish!
