STATE OF BEING OR HOW SOMETHING IS

(PLACE+)

POSITION/POSICIÓN: to express position

where a person or thing is at physically:
 Estoy en la ciudad de Madrid. I am in the city of Madrid.
 Mi marido está en casa. My husband is at home.

LOCATION/UBICACIÓN: to express or indicate location, to ask about the location of a person or object · where a person or thing is at on a physical map or in accordance with your surroundings; it can also refer to where something is permanently, temporarily or conceptually located:

La silla está al lado del escritorio. The chair is next to the desk.

Los perros están en la alfombra. The dogs are on the rug.

***recuerda: se usa "ser" para eventos

ACTION/ACCIÓN: to express actions [estar + gerund]

· to use with progressive tenses:

Estamos leyendo el libro esta semana. We are reading the book this week.

CONDITION/CONDICIÓN: to express conditions, states of health or being

· depending on the situation, using the word "estar" can describe physical and mental conditions: Estás sano, ¿verdad? You're healthy, aren't you?

Estás tan cansada esta mañana. You are very tired this morning.

Mi vecina está enferma hoy. My neighbor is sick today.

Tu perro está un poco confundido. Your dog is a little confused.

EMOTION/EMOCIÓN: to express emotions, changes in feelings or perceptions; or to convey a feeling or perception

 \cdot to describe how a person is feeling at any time, a state that will not last very long:

Ellos están contentos. They are happy.

Estoy triste porque obtuve una mala nota. *I'm sad because I got a bad grade*.

Él está aburrido porque no tiene tarea. He is bored because he has no homework.

AS WELL AS/ADEMÁS:

CHANGE FROM THE NORM/CAMBIO DE LA NORMA: to express a change from the norm (a condition), or how the speaker feels about or perceives the person or object

Jorge está delgado.* Jorge is thin. (Jorge looks thin.)

IDIOMATIC EXPRESSIONS/EXPRESIONES IDIOMÁTICAS: to use with various idiomatic expressions.

María está en los nubes. María is daydreaming.
