Dr. Jason Heald currently serves as Director of Music at Umpqua Community College, and is an active composer, performer, educator, and clinician in the Pacific Northwest. He holds a Ph.D. in composition from University of Oregon, a master's degree from University of Portland, and a bachelor's degree from Lewis and Clark College. Dr. Heald is a prolific composer, with works published by Augsburg Press, ChoralWeb, UNC Jazz Press, Plymouth Music, Sound Music Publishing, and Call of the Wild Publishing.

Recent premiers and commissions include performances by the Oregon Musical Theatre Festival, Shreveport Opera, Vanguard Voices, Delgani Quartet, Consonare, Kantorei, The Singers – Minnesota Choral Artists, the Willamette Singers, Lake County Symphony Orchestra, Umpqua Chamber Orchestra, Peter Argondizza, guitarists Cameron O'Connor and James Bishop-Edwards, soprano Linda Larson, and Halcyon Trio Oregon. Recent awards include Grand Prize Winner, Eventide Arts Songfest (Dennis MA); Grand Prize winner, Cascadian Choral Composition Competition (Seattle, WA); Longfellow Chorus Award of Distinction in Choral Composition (Portland, ME); Vanguard Premieres Composition Contest (Detroit, MI); Sacred Voice Arts Song Finalist, (Salt Lake City, UT); Finalist, 21st Annual Ithaca College of Music Choral Composition Competition (Ithaca, NY); and Project Encore Composer, (New York, NY). Heald's orchestral concerts have featured Grammy award-winning artists Mason Williams and Tingstad and Rumbel, Craig Chaquico (Jefferson Starship), the Four Freshmen, Delgani String Quartet, and jazz vocalist Haley Loren. Dr. Heald has also been the recipient of many ASCAP symphonic and educational awards.

American Patrol

- FW Meacham

A march written by F.W. Meacham in 1885, originally for piano, that became popular as a patriotic instrumental piece. It includes themes from popular American patriotic songs and was later made into a jazz arrangement for the Glenn Miller Orchestra in 1942. This piece was a staple of American popular music for many decades. It includes *Columbia*, *the Gem of the Ocean*, *Dixie*, and *Yankee Doodle*.

Concerto for 2 Violas in G Major – Soloists Isadora Trinkle & Juliet Long

- Georg Philipp Telemann

Concerto for 2 Violas was written shortly after Telemann's only visit to France in 1737-1738, and has some distinctively French characteristics. Telemann famously wrote concertos for various combinations of instruments, but this one is unusual because, at that time, the viola was not a popular solo instrument. Telemann was a viola player himself and wrote several pieces for the instrument. There are four movements:

No. 18 Air. "Rejoice Greatly, O Daughter of Zion, from Messiah –

Isadora Trinkle, Soprano

-George Frederic Handel

Messiah, the English-language oratorio composed by Handel in 1741, is structured in three parts and this is from Part I. The phrase, "Daughter of Zion," is a poetic metaphor referring to the people of Jerusalem or God's people in general. *Rejoice, Greatly*, is a call from the Book of Zechariah to celebrate the coming of a righteous, humble king who will bring salvation and peace.

-Gabriel Fauré

Op. 80 is a suite derived from incidental music by Gabriel Fauré for Maurice Maeterlinck's play of the same name. Fauré later wrote this four movement piece using much of that same music. There was a very short deadline for the play, causing Fauré to write to his wife: I hardly have a month and a half to write all that music. True, some of it is already in my thick head!

Vive La Roy – Josquin des Prez

A fanfare composed around 1504, originally for 4 voices, and was likely used to celebrate King Louis XII.

Straf' mich nicht in deinem Zorn - J.S. Bach, Arr. by Jason Heald.

This is a German hymn text, a paraphrase of Psalm 6, set as a chorale harmonization. The hymn uses an anonymous, 17th-century melody of secular origin.

A Tribute to Burt Bacharach & Hal David – The Umpqua Singers

-Burt Bacharach and Hal David, Arr. by Jason Heald

This Tribute celebrates both men's influential songwriting partnership. They were known for creating classic hits during the 1960s and 70s that blended jazz, pop, and R&B. They strongly impacted many musical genres, leaving a legacy honored by musicians and the general public. Hal David was the lyricist to Burt Bacharach's sophisticated melodies, defining the music of the 60s and 70s.
