Program

Fugue in G Minor, BWV 578

- J.S. Bach

Often called the "The Little Fugue" to distinguish it from his long Great Fantasia and Fugue 542. Bach was a composer and musician of the late Baroque period, composing many works, including the Brandenburg Concertos. This piece, 578, was written for Organ. For a while, Bach was the Court Composer for Augustus III of Poland.

Pavane, Op. 50

- Fauré

The Pavane is a short work by the French composer Gabriel Fauré written in 1887. It was originally a piano piece, but is better known in Fauré's version for orchestra and optional chorus. It was first performed in Paris in 1888, becoming one of the composer's most popular works.

Selections from Mamma Mia

ABBA - arr. by Roy Phillippe

The plot follows a young bride-to-be who invites three men to her wedding, each one possibly being her father. "Mamma Mia" is widely considered to be one of ABBA's best songs. In 2017, Billboard ranked the song number seven on their list of the 15 greatest ABBA songs. This piece also features S.O.S and Dancing Queen.

Swan Lake Suite

-Tchaikovsky

Le Lac Des Cygnes (Swan Lake) is a suite of dances from the ballet Swan Lake by Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky. The Moscow premiere in March, 1877, was not well received. Though there were a few critics who recognized the virtues of the score, most considered it to be far too complicated for ballet. It was labelled "too noisy, too 'Wagnerian' and too symphonic." Yet, it was performed 41 more times; longer than many other ballets of that era. Despite its initial failure, it is now one of the most popular ballets of all time

Our Harpist:

George Leverett, Harpist

George began his journey on the harp back in 1994. He originally was a business student in college, an aspiring accountant. However, with the economic and career uncertainty inherent in that profession, he decided to take the easy way out and became a musician instead. George spent the 1990's traveling the west coast playing harp in a Celtic group called Clan na Gael. In the 2000's he and his wife continued performing as a duo, which they still do today. George took up the Concert Harp (pedal harp) in 2015, expanding on his interest from the folk harp, and has a repertoire which ranges a variety of styles and genres. In 2022, George was looking for something to focus his midlife crisis and in the energy of that moment moved to the Concert Grand Harp, featured in today's performance.

Over the years he's performed in numerous settings, including fairs / festivals, school programs, weddings, funerals, concerts, arts council programs, and private events, as well as recording 9 CDs with his wife. Having driven every highway in California, Oregon, Washington, Nevada, Arizona, & Idaho, he can tell you with certainty the location of every rest stop, and distance to the next town.

When not playing music, George is also a luthier; you can find him in his woodshop building hurdy-gurdies.

Program

You're the One That I Want – from Grease -John Ferrar - Arr. by Douglas E. Wagner

Written in 1978 by Farrar for the movie version of Grease, "You're the One That I Want" was one of the two singles Farrar wrote specifically for Newton-John's appearance in the film that had not been in the original stage musical.

Concert for Flute and Harp, C major K.V. 299

-W.A.Mozart

One of only two true double concertos that he wrote, Mozart composed this in April 1778, in Paris. Commissioned by Duc de Guines, a flutist, for his daughter, a harpist, they had a falling out and Mozart was never paid for this composition. The Harp was still being developed in the 1700s, and not considered an orchestral instrument.

Harry Potter Symphonic Suite

- John Williams, Arr. by J. Brubaker

This medley, based on the endearing themes from the box office smash hit Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone, weaves the vivid imagery of the film with varied textures to produce a work that is loved by all. Though Williams only scored the first three films, several motifs that he created have been reprised and incorporated into the remaining scores, in particular "Hedwig's Theme", which can be heard in all eight films.

Bacchanale – from Samson and Delilah

-Saint- Saëns

Saint-Saens was a Romantic-era composer in France. The Bacchanale is the big dance from Samson and Delilah, one of Saint-Saëns' most renowned operas based on the story of the two characters. The biblical story of the heroic Hebraic strongman and his dangerous and enticing lover/betrayer has enjoyed a steady presence in opera houses worldwide since 1877.
