



Thank you so much for choosing this ribbon curtain - we hope you will love it as much as we do. Each of our ribbon curtains are hand-made and unique.

Fixing Instructions:

1. Take the curtain out of the bag and lay over the back of a chair or similar
2. Separate the strip of sticky backed, adhesive Velcro from the top of the curtain
3. Remove the paper backing from the adhesive Velcro and stick the Velcro into place above the door or window where you plan to hang your curtain. This strip of Velcro should stay in place so that you can hang your ribbon curtain up or down as you wish
4. Take the ribbon curtain and stick the Velcro at the top of the curtain onto the strip above your door/window and let the curtain hang down
5. Undo the ribbons tied around the curtain and let the strands hang free, any creasing in the ribbons resulting from storage will soon disappear
6. Whenever you want to take the curtain down, use the tab at the top of the curtain to pull it gently away from the Velcro strip you have stuck above the door
7. Use the organza bag it came in to store the curtain when not in use

Care Instructions:

1. Any creasing in the ribbons which has resulted from storage will drop out once the curtain has been hanging for a few hours
2. The end of the ribbons have been treated to reduce fraying, however, very rarely, some fraying may occur over time – if this happens, cut off the end of the ribbon, just above the frayed area to prevent further unravelling. *(Tip- if you have to do this stick a piece of sticky tape on the end of the ribbon to minimise further fraying)*
3. If the ribbon curtain is too long you can cut the ribbons to size – it is best to avoid having lengths of ribbon trailing on the floor. If you do this, please be aware that there may be a risk of ribbons fraying more easily though this can be managed as outlined above
4. Your ribbon curtain probably won't need washing, however if it does then a gentle handwash and then drip-dry over an outside line is recommended
5. Don't forget these curtains are not fire-proof or flame-proof. Be careful if you have young children as they are not designed as toys.
