Dear School Community,

My newsletter entry this week is around two timeframes: looking backwards and looking forwards.

### **Looking backwards:**

Thank you school community with getting your child or children to school every day during what was a very eventful winter and early spring. As a community we certainly seemed to have high rates of sickness, particularly breathing related illness. Thank you for responding respectfully when required to collect your child due to illness at any point throughout a school day. Once again, we also received very positive results in both Naplan (in both Reading and Numeracy) and the Years 4/5/6 Attitudes to School survey with very positive responses. There has also been some very positive improvements in Maths results in our Progressive Achievement Test (PAT) results across Years 2 thru 6.

#### **Looking forward:**

We are very much looking forward to continuing high school attendance rates and also improved rates for those children who had more severe illness during winter. We look forward to continuing to develop purposeful teaching and learning in all areas, particularly Literacy and Numeracy. We also look forward to other events that will continue to build a positive Wellbeing and Learning environment. These will include; Halloween disco, Colour Run, Xmas concert and the whole school swimming program.

Finally, another positive Wellbeing instance is the end of Term out of uniform day. It is a routine here at ESPS, (that unless otherwise directed ie excursion/photos etc) children are allowed to come to school on the last day of every school term out of school uniform. Along with this, children are required to bring a gold coin donation. Our school captains will collect the monies, then bank this money with Sharon at the office. At the end of each year, the School Captains can then decide, with consultation, to donate the monies to a good cause organisation. For example: local hospital, seeing eye dogs, hearing impaired. 


