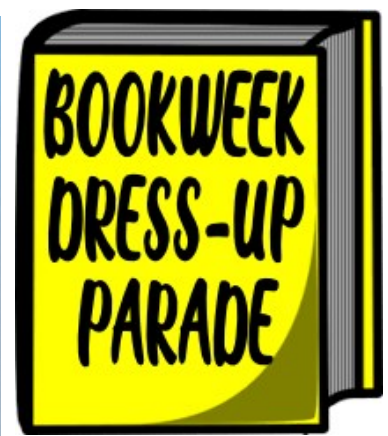

This space is where students can come together for some quiet play. All the while learning how to play respectfully with one another. A staff member is on hand to guide students if required.



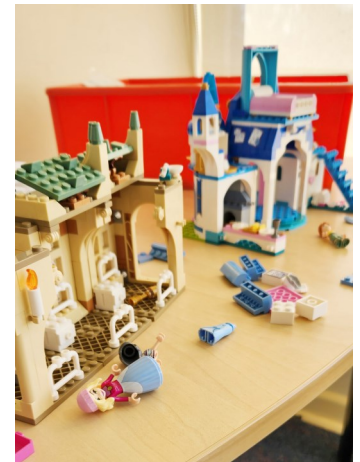
Uno is a fave, along with the Lego donated by The Sixth Child Organisation. Puppets are always fun!

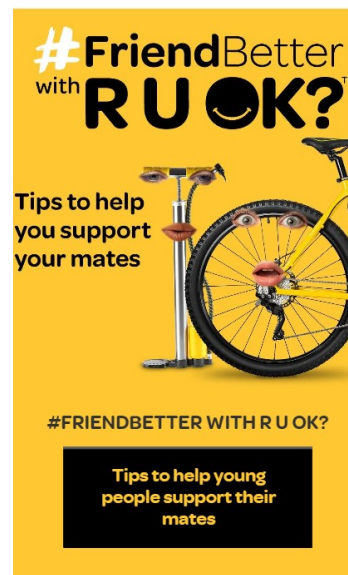
