



We have 30 tickets together in the same section.



Consistory in Brief First United Church of Christ Hellertown Monday, March 13, 2023 at 6:30 pm (In-Person)

Tammie Vosburg, our Treasurer, informed us that for the first time in more than a year, we had income exceeding expenses to date for the year. However, our Investment Market Gains are 3.45%, down from January 2.55%. Some good news is that we may be eligible to receive money through the Employee Retention Tax credit given for 2020 -2021. Another effort to save money is our contract renewals; renegotiations are in process and could result in savings for us.

Pastor Becky Thomas noted that the Thursday Zoom Bible Study for Lent has been successful and plans for an Advent study that may include both a morning and evening study to accommodate more members. Breakdown of hours for primary responsibilities: Hours Dedicated to Worship: 35, Hours Dedicated to Pastoral Care: 7, Continuing Education Hours: 5,Office Hours: 26, Meetings: 5

Faith Formation Minister, Marji Hughes, shared the news that 90 Easter Baskets were filled for children. We owe a great appreciation to the volunteers and to Sandy Panick's leadership. Also, the Faith and Fun Day scheduled for March 26 will move to a future date.

Georgie Stuempfle reported that the Elders are sending cards to recognize special milestone birthdays among our members as well as get sell cards.

Sandy Panick reported the Deacons are planning for a Maundy Thursday Communion combined worship service with Lower Saucon UCC.

The Trustees noted we were issued a "Temporary Certification" status for the use of our kitchen area. This license will allow meal preparations for 14 days a year and must be renewed yearly. We, however, must replace the kitchen's 8ft fluorescent light bulbs with LED to meet regulations. The annual Yard Spring Clean up is April 22, 9 - 12 noon.

Pastor Becky reported from Music and Worship Committee that our The Maundy Thursday service plan is to strip the altar of items as was done in the past. The choir will assist in this effort during the service. On May 14, we will celebrate Youth Worship Sunday and Mothers' Day.

Georgie Stuempfle, Stewardship Committee Leadership Chair, has gathered a team with several volunteers to work on a monthly project throughout the year to raise additional funds to supplement our income and expenses. Members of the Stewardship Committee are David and Georgie Stuempfle, Carl Ann Broglie, Bob Turner, and Tammie Vosburg. Georgie is the liaison to Consistory. The first official event in March – The Cottage and Shepherd's Pie Sale.
